

# **Mingkaman - IDP Intentions Assessment**

Awerial County, Lakes State, South Sudan

#### Methodology

These findings are based on primary data collected by REACH, between 9th September and 16th September 2015.

REACH staff interviewed IDPs in Mingkaman to understand where they have come from, where they would go if they were able to leave, and what push and pull factors inform their decisions.

A random sample of 461 households were interviewed, providing a representative sample of the roughly 10,760 dwelling units with a confidence of 95% and a margin of error of 5%


