2. Rationale

2.1. Rationale

In February 2020, Iraq reported its first confirmed case of the coronavirus, also known as COVID-19. As of May 5, according to the World Health Organization (WHO), 2,345 cases had been recorded in Iraq, with 703 cases still considered active. Cases have been reported across all governorates in the country, with the actual caseload expected to be far higher, owing to limited testing and reporting. The 55,730 IDPs residing in 43 camps across Iraq are considered to face heightened and unique threats from the virus, owing to their status as displaced persons, infrastructure in camps, and related factors. Due to movement restrictions in place across the country, IDPs cannot enter or exit camps. This increases the need for an updated map of infrastructure services and infrastructure in place, especially health centres and markets. Reflecting these circumstances, the Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) cluster, with input from partners and other clusters, has developed initial consolidated guidance on preparedness and response in camps.

The guidance prepared by CCCM provides instruction on the necessary infrastructure, planning, policies, and related measures needed to prepare and respond to the threat of COVID-19 to people residing in camps. Currently, it is not known to what extent individual camps are meeting these standards. In order for humanitarian actors and other partners to appropriately design their assistance and response, information on the current circumstances and capacity of camps is necessary. REACH Initiative (REACH) is ideally positioned to respond to this need, reflecting years of experience conducting assessments with IDPs in camp settings and developing camp profiles, and an established working relationship with the CCCM cluster and its members. By preparing the proposed COVID-19 Camp Preparedness Profiles, REACH can fill the information gap on camp preparedness, capacity, and needs, assisting humanitarian actors in organizing their response to COVID-19.

3. Methodology

2.1. Methodology overview

This project will use a closed-question Key Informant Interview methodology, implemented through phone calls, satellite imagery analysis and secondary data sources. Data collection will be conducted in IDP camps in: Anbar, Baghdad, Duhok, Diyala, Erbil, Kerbala, Kirkuk, Ninewa, Salah al-Din and Sulaymaniyah governorates.

- Camp manager Key Informant (KI) interview: 43 interviews with camp manager(s) to gather information about COVID-19 response in their respective camps. Due to the lockdown imposed across the country, interviews will be conducted on the phone.
- Mapping: Mapping of key indicators for COVID-19 such as health facilities or market availability in camp.

Remote data collection will be conducted on the phone by Senior Field Coordinators, starting the 5th of May. Data cleaning will be conducted on a daily basis during data collection. Infrastructure maps from previous camp assessments will be reviewed daily through phone calls for any potential data conflicts or updates based on infrastructure indicators asked in the tool and based on a health services infrastructure list provided by the Health Cluster. Data that is deemed inconsistent from the data cleaning or map review will be highlighted and shared with Senior Field Coordinators for clarification or rectification. Once data collection is complete, factsheets will be created using the information from the camp manager KI interviews. Due to the quickly evolving situation, the assessment will be conducted periodically, as needed, to ensure that camp preparedness profiles will be continuously updated. Data will be cleaned and analysed using R, Excel, and ArcGIS Pro.

2.2. Population of interest

- **Geographical area:** IDP camps in Iraq with more than a hundred households in the following governorates: Anbar, Baghdad, Dohuk, Diyala, Erbil, Kerbala, Kirkuk, Ninewa, Salah al-Din and Sulaymaniyah governorates.
- Population: camp managers (KI interview).

2.3. Secondary data review

A secondary data review will be conducted by REACH in order to complement remote data collection. Sources to be reviewed include:

- Camp profiling Rounds XII and XIII
- <u>CCCM FSMT</u> (Formal Site Monitoring Tool)
- REACH WASH Assessment for needs in camp
- Other relevant assessments in any sector conducted in the IDP camps assessed within the same time frame.
- Geo-spatial data (e.g. UNOSAT satellite imagery)

2.4. Primary Data Collection

- Method: Senior Field Coordinators will conduct remote data collection (KI interviews) via phone calls. Camp
 managers were purposively sampled since they are knowledgeable about the camp, and their contact details were
 previously gathered during the camp profiling conducted between February and March 2020. Each Senior Field
 Coordinators will be provided with the contact details of relevant camp managers.
- Tool: The tool has been developed following <u>CCCM Cluster guidance on camp-level preparedness</u>, with additional consultations with CCCM, Shelter, WASH, Protection and Health Clusters. KI interviews will be conducted with camp managers. They will be asked closed questions about camp preparedness, awareness communication and training, impact of the lockdown on access to cash and markets, communal infrastructures closed in camp, access to emergency services in camp, shift in type of distributions and current policy on quarantine areas and COVID-19 suspected cases. The closed question tool will enable rapid analysis and aggregation at national level.
- Amendment to the tool: The tool will be adapted following appropriate piloting, as needed, and any amendment to
 the tool will be done in consultation with the CCCM, Shelter, WASH, Protection and Health Clusters, but with the aim
 of maintaining consistency between rounds to enable comparability.
- Debriefing: As much as possible, data will be uploaded on a daily basis by REACH Senior Field Coordinators to be
 reviewed by the GIS Officer and cleaned by the Assessment Officer who will provide feedback to the Senior Field
 Coordinators. Feedback will be shared on a daily basis via google spreadsheet or phone with REACH Senior Field
 Coordinators to support their morning debriefing to the field teams.

2.5. Data Processing & Analysis

- Senior Field Coordinators will use an Open Data Kit (ODK) to collect the surveys during the phone calls and will
 update them every evening to the REACH Kobo server.
- Data cleaning will be carried out by the Assessment Officer and GIS Officer on a daily basis, in line with the IMPACT
 Data Cleaning Minimum Standards Checklist. Follow-up data collection will be conducted if deemed necessary to
 address inconsistencies or information gaps. Data that is deemed inconsistent will be highlighted and shared with the
 relevant Field Coordinator for clarification/rectification. These inquiries will be logged in a shared Google Sheet in
 which field team focal points for each base can provide follow up responses. All changes will then be made and
 logged by REACH staff
- Once data for all the camps has been completed, the Assessment Officer in charge will conduct analysis through R
 and/or excel and amalgamate all the data into one database. Anonymized version of the raw data, clean data,
 cleaning log and deleted logs will be sent to the HQ data unit for final review and validation.
- The GIS Officer will update infrastructure data as needed. Once a baseline has been collected, future results will be compared to the ones of the previous rounds in order to identify trends in the evolution of preparedeness in camps.
- A national factsheet will be produced after each round of data collection, to ensure that up-to-date information is available.
