



Informal Settlement Profile: Rustam Camp

Bagrami District, Kabul Province, Afghanistan

Background

This profile provides an overview of conditions in the informal settlement **Rustam Camp**, located in Bagrami district, Kabul province. This settlement is **urban** and its residents live in **partial mud houses**.

Displacement

Rustam Camp is one of three informal settlements in Qala-e Barqi Camp, situated in Kabul's District 8. The land is owned by the Government of Afghanistan and residents are currently not paying rent. The population is mostly comprised of Tajiks, with 30% coming from Pashtun communities. All residents are IDPs from Laghman and Nangarhar provinces.

The first wave of IDPs consisted of three households from the Quarghayi, Laghman in 2004. A year later, 29 households joined the site, also from Quarghayi. In 2006, a final 8 households from Nangarhar joined the settlement. As there is no longer space to expand, the site has since remained stable.

The residents of Rustam Camp reportedly intend to stay in the settlement as they have access to essential services, such as health and education facilities.

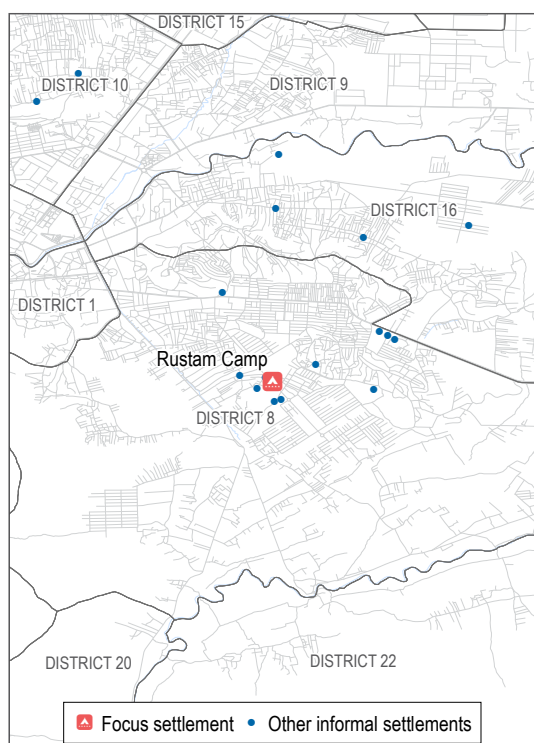
