Summary

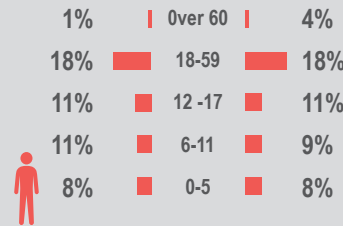
