

## Introduction

This multi-sector needs assessment is part of a monthly data collection exercise which aims to gather information about needs and the humanitarian situation inside Syria. The factsheets present information collected in February 2016, referring to the situation in January 2015.

These factsheets present information at the community/village level for each sub-district in Quneitra governorate\*. Selected key indicators for the following sectors are included in the factsheets: displacement, shelter, NFIs, health, food security, WASH, education. The factsheets do not cover the entire range of indicators gathered in the questionnaire.

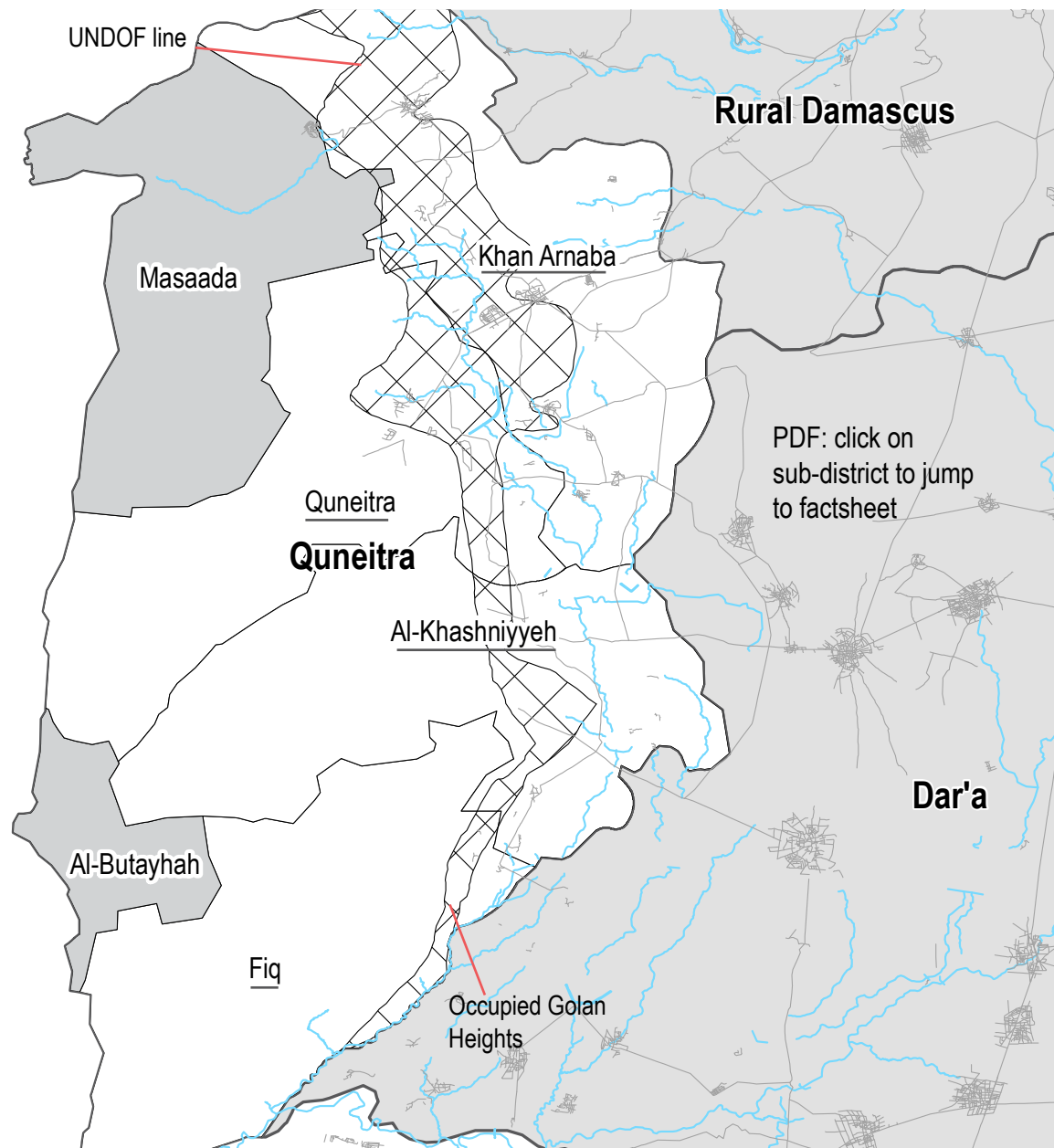
In February 2016, conflict in Dar'a governorate caused complex displacement of people, with many displaced to Quneitra. REACH conducted a rapid assessment of humanitarian needs of recently arrived IDPs in Quneitra, which can be used as an update to the information presented in these factsheets. ## Methodology and limitations

These findings are based on data collected remotely (in Jordan, Lebanon, Kurdistan Region of Iraq and Turkey) from Key Informants residing in their community of origin in Syria.

Information was collected from Key Informants in 22 communities in all 4 sub-districts of Quneitra governorate. For each question asked, confidence levels are assigned based on the Key Informant's area of expertise and knowledge of the sector-specific situation.

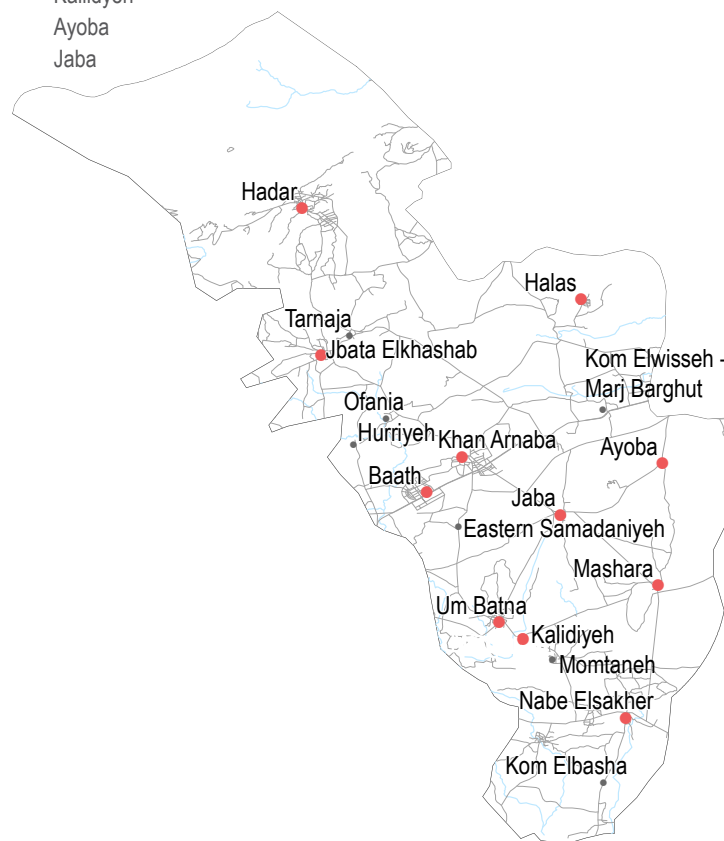

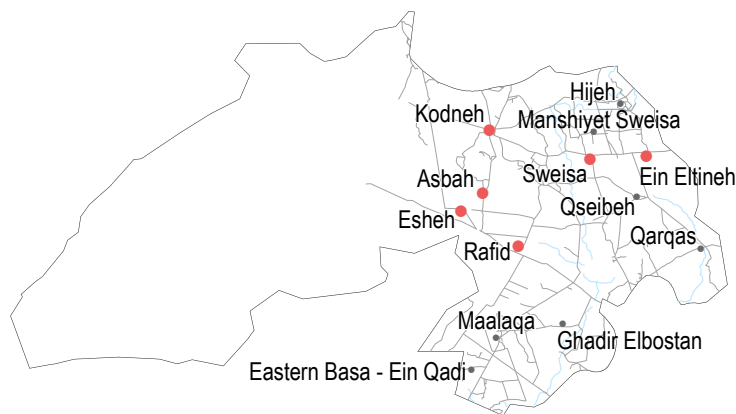

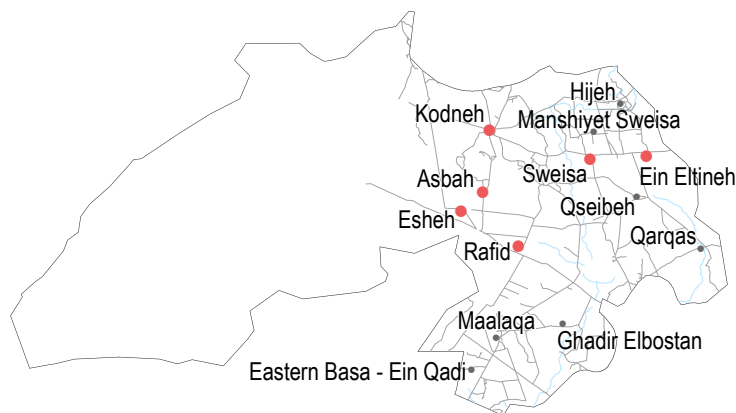
