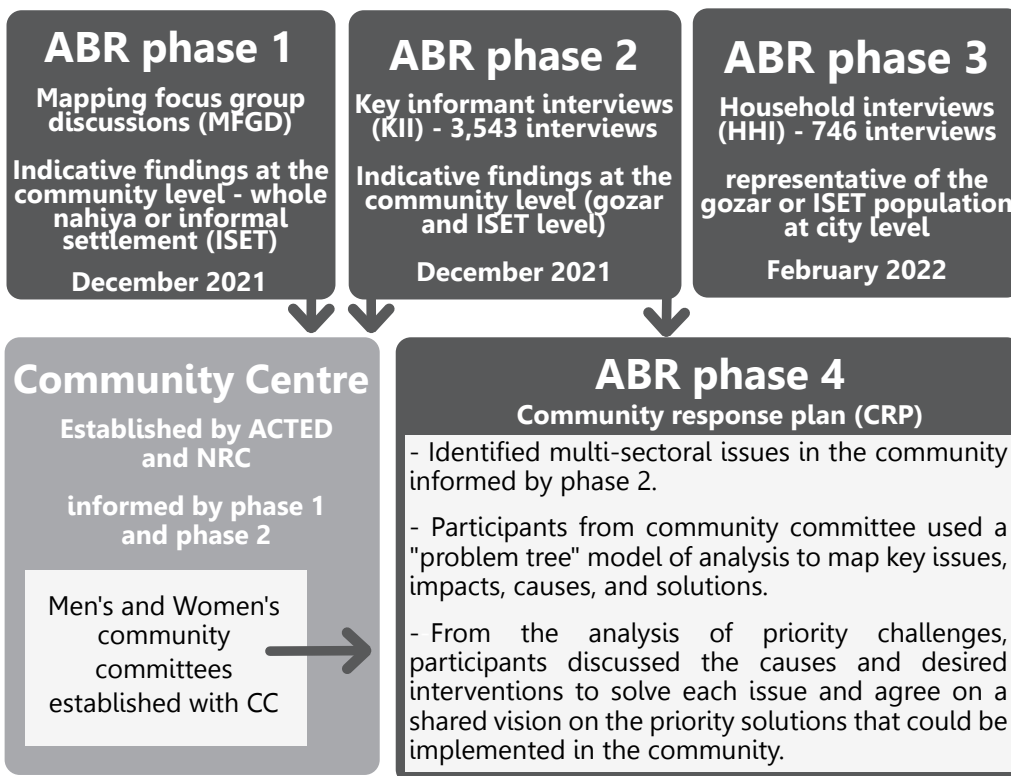

### Introduction and Background

Developed through community planning workshops with local community representatives following the completion of REACH Area Based Response (ABR) assessment from November 2021 to February 2022, Community Response Plans (CRPs) are reports that outline a shared local vision for community wide interventions.

Facilitated by a consortium of ACTED, NRC and IMPACT, CRPs take an evidence based approach to planning, effectively translating response gaps identified through REACH ABR into actionable intervention strategies, formulated as specific projects. Using a community-led planning approach, CRPs act as a road map for multi-sectoral interventions.<sup>1</sup>

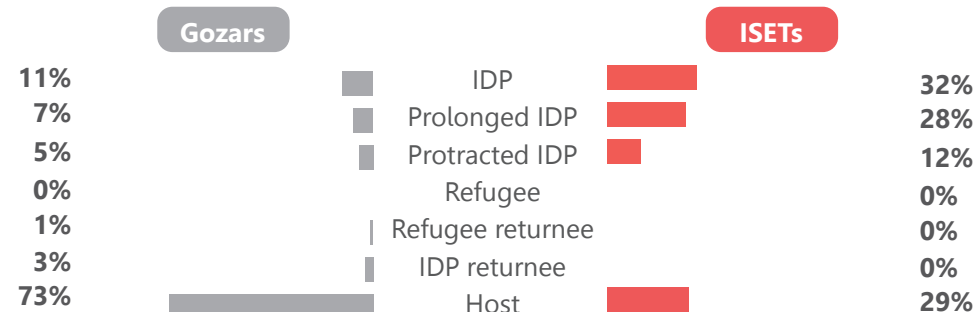

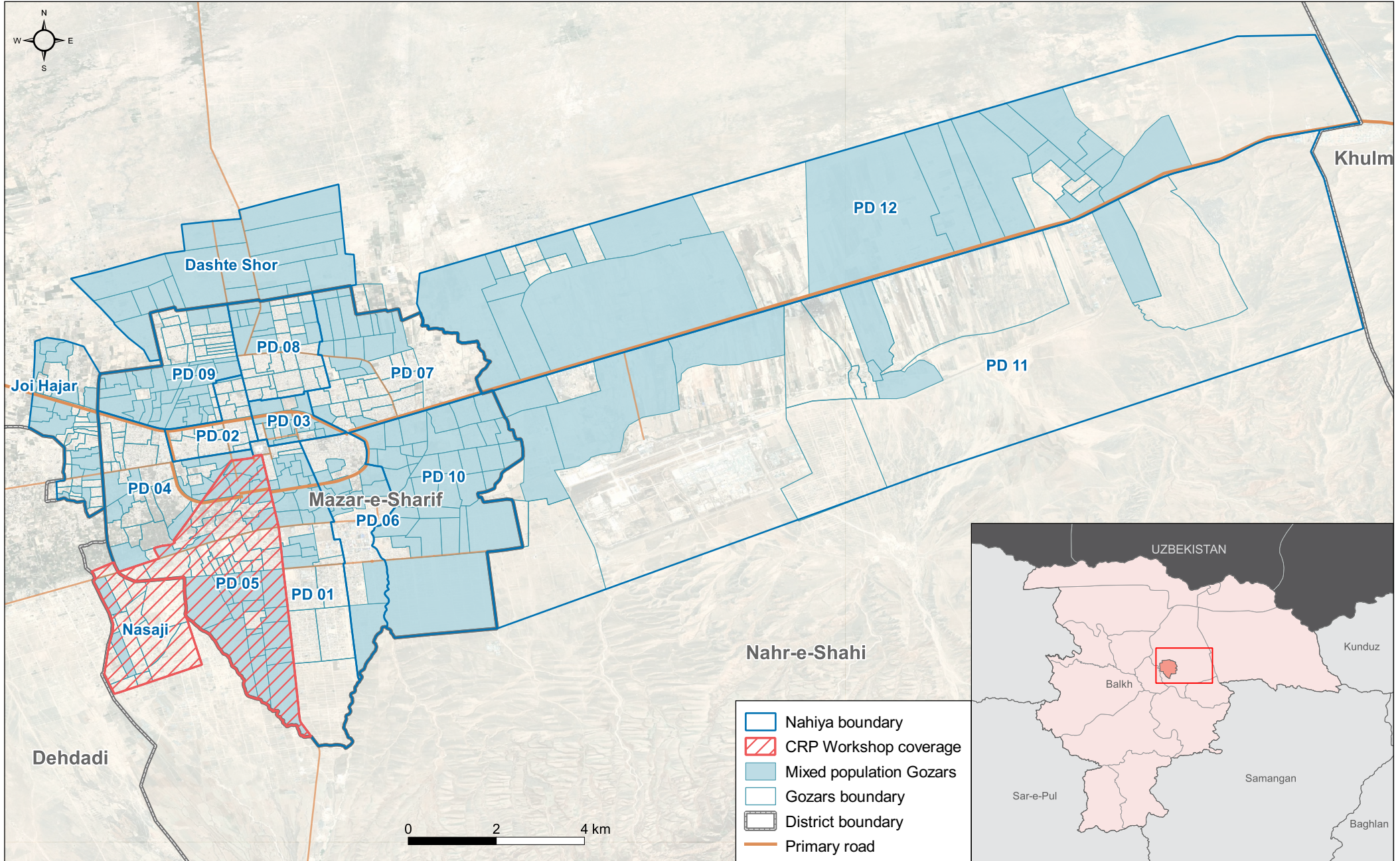


% distribution of displacement groups within nahiya

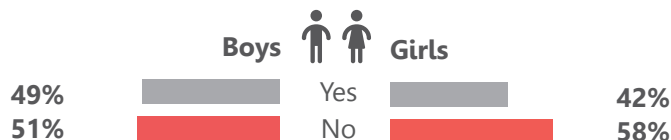




## Q KEY ISSUES &amp; RECOMMENDATIONS

## Education

% of KIs reporting **most school age children are able to attend primary school**:



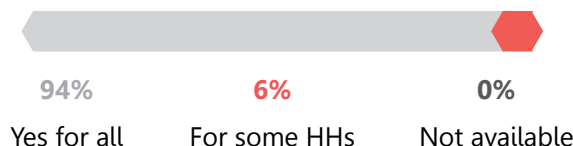
The most reported barrier for primary school aged boys (72%) and girls (67%) to access education facilities was the lack of primary school in the area.

## Stakeholder recommendations:

Construction of secondary school, funding and equipping primary school, recruitment of teachers for primary school, literacy courses for males and females, girl's education awareness, construction of kindergarten.

## Electricity

% of KIs who reported the **availability of electricity**:



**87%** of KIs reported that most HHs experienced power outages but rarely.

## Stakeholder recommendations:

Provision and improvement of electricity in community.

## Stakeholder recommendations:

Establishment of a unit for waste collection management, creation of green zones, awareness workshops for environmental concerns, planting fruit trees.

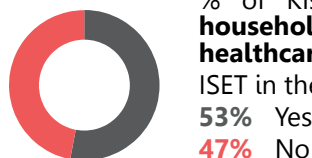

## Stakeholder recommendations:

Providing emergency food assistance, bus station and transport arrangement to market.

## Healthcare

% of KIs who reported that **most households had access to an active healthcare centre** close to their gozar/ISET in the past 3 months:



All KIs reported that households facing access barriers could not afford to access services (100%), could not access due to lack of transport (94%) or due to insufficient female medical staff (63%).

## Stakeholder recommendations:

Establishment of a health centre (primary or secondary), construction of healthcare clinic building, establishment of mobile healthcare team, transport to health centre, rehabilitation of incomplete hospital building.

## Livelihoods

The **most common form of income** in the settlement reported by KIs:

**95%** Daily labour, no contract

## Stakeholder recommendations:

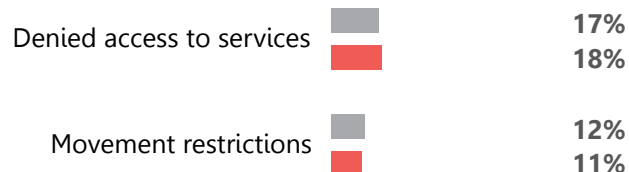
Establishment of green houses and small gardens, distribution of poultry, providing fund for small businesses in market, establishment of factory, poultry and livestock for females, supporting small businesses.

## Protection

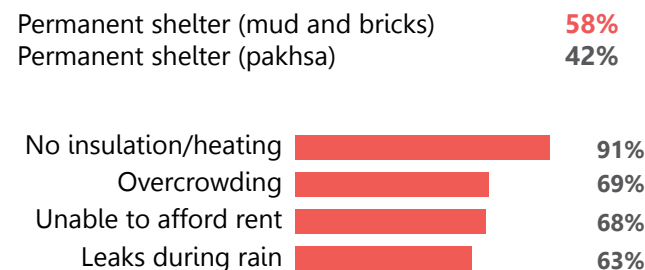
% of KIs who reported being aware of **protection incidents** in the past 3 months (most reported):

Conducting awareness raising workshops, building trust, coordination and networking between community and government through joint workshops, under age marriages awareness, recruitment of watchmen.

## Shelter/NFI

% of KIs reporting the **main shelter concerns** in the ISET/gozar:

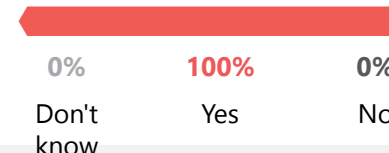
**Stakeholder recommendations:**

Building shelters, provision of NFI and shelter.

## WASH

**77%** of KIs reported that most people are unable to access sufficient quantity of water to meet daily needs (drinking, cooking, domestic use and hygiene)

% of KIs reporting there are **publicly available water points** in their gozar/ISET:

**Stakeholder recommendations:**

Installation of water network, excavation of wells with solar system and water purifier machines, canalization of Sholgara river or Tangi Shadyan area, installation/building water reserves (tanks) in the mosques, excavation of wells with solar system and water purifier machine, awareness raising on water usage.

## Waste management

% of KIs reporting the **most common method of waste management**:

**Stakeholder recommendations:**

Distribution of hygiene and garbage gathering kits, installation of dustbins for waste collections, collection of waste and garbage.
