Summary

Al Wand Caravan IDP camp was established in December 2014 as a formal site for internally displaced persons (IDPs) who had settled in the area. The main area of origin of the resident IDPs is Khanaqin and Muqdadiya Districts, Diyala Governorate.

Primary data was collected through household surveys from 08 to 11/12/2014. The camp was still under development at the time of the assessment. Additional information from camp managers, marked (*) is correct as of 11/12/2014.

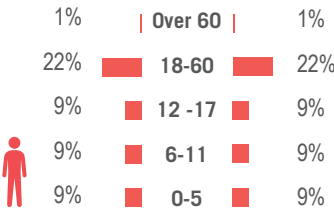

Key Developments

Al Wand Caravan camp in Diyala government was opened in early December. The target for allocations is one caravan to a household for every 8 members. By this system a household of 9 people will be allocated 2 caravans and 2 families of the same household may occupy the same caravan. Relocation of IDPs to the camp was ongoing during the assessment. Since the assessment many families have moved out of the camp to other areas of Diyala including Al Yawa New Camp.

All IDP households had received NFI assistance in the past month. This included clothing, received by 65%, footwear (51%) and hygiene kits (49%). 12% had received a food package consisting of less than a standard Family Food Parcel (staple carbohydrates, pulses, oil, sugar and iodized salt).

12% of households had at least one member missing civil documents. 28% of households included a pregnant or lactating woman. 16% had a member with a serious medical condition and 13% a member with a physical or mental disability.
