Mobbar LGA WASH Baseline - Key Findings

Borno State, Nigeria

September 2017

REACH, in partnership with the Nigeria WASH Sector and Global WASH Cluster carried out a baseline assessment on WASH related vulnerabilities amongst Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), returnees and non-displaced populations in multiple Local Government Area (LGA) capitals in Borno State. This factsheet provides an overview of key findings from the WASH baseline assessment.

Findings are based on data collected through a household level survey between 28 September-1 October 2017. A total of 245 randomly selected households in Mobbar LGA were interviewed. Findings can be generalised to the LGA capital population with a 95% confidence level and a 9% margin of error.



Water

43% of IDP, % of non-displaced, and **24%** of returnee housholds in Mobbar LGA reported sufficient access to water¹ in the past 30 days to meet household needs.


