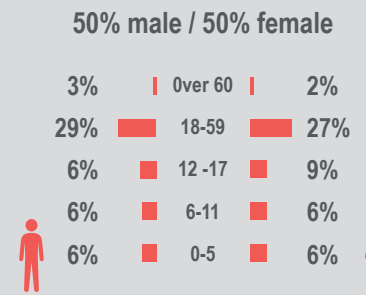
## Summary

This profile provides an overview of conditions in Ankawa 2 camp. Primary data was collected through household surveys on 10-04-16. Households were randomly sampled to a 95% confidence and 10% margin of error, based on population figures provided by CCCM. In some cases, additional information from camp managers has been used to support findings. Round IV of data collection was in December 2015.
