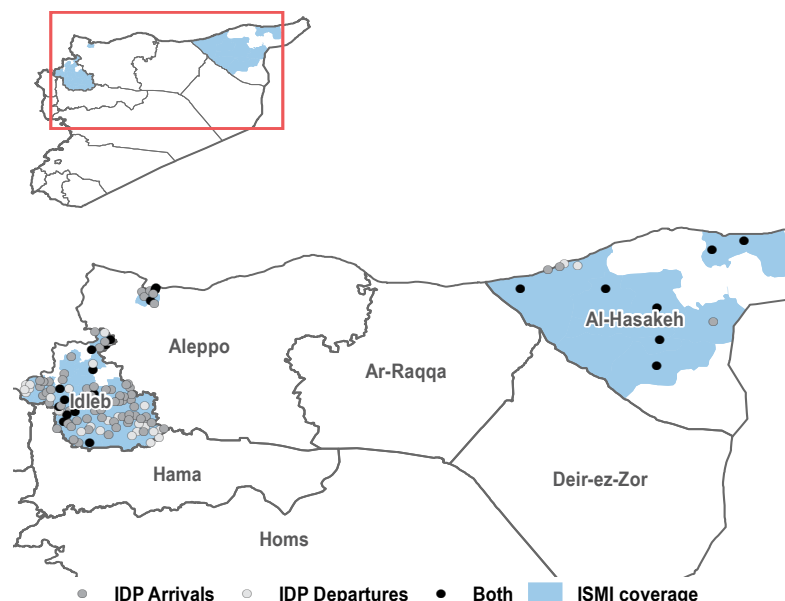


OVERALL FINDINGS: 1-15 November

- 137 out of 602 ISMI-covered communities in Aleppo (A'zaz sub-district)², Al-Hasakeh and Idleb governorates experienced inward or outward movement of IDPs.
- Al-Hasakeh witnessed an arrival of 24,249 IDPs, primarily to Areesheh (13,720), Ras Al Ain (5,922) and Shadadah (2,640) sub-districts.
- In parallel, Idleb governorate saw an arrival of 18,110 IDPs, with the majority to Sanjar (5,011), Saraqab (3,195), Dana (3,034) and Ma'arrat An Nu'man (2,452) sub-districts.
- A'zaz sub-district in Aleppo saw an arrival of 1,289 IDPs, most commonly to Sharmin (935) and Shmarekh (171) communities.

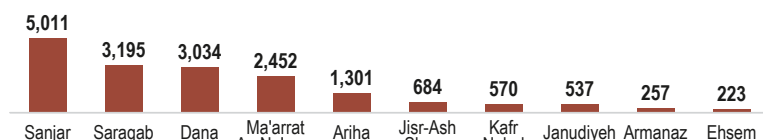

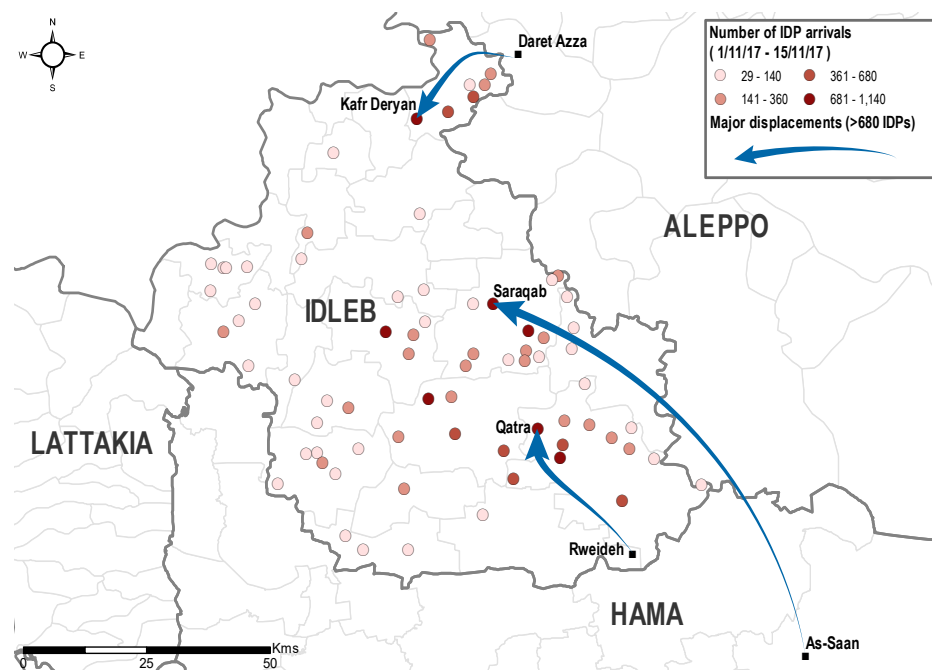
IDLEB GOVERNORATE

Between 1 and 15 November, ISMI-covered communities in Idlib governorate witnessed the arrival of 18,110 IDPs, most commonly to Sanjar (5,011), Saraqab (3,195), Dana (3,034) and Ma'arrat An Nu'man (2,452) sub-districts (Figure 1). Meanwhile, 15,614 IDPs left ISMI-covered communities in Idlib, with almost two thirds from Sanjar (4,965), Kafr Deryan (1,425), Seraa camp (1,197), Tilaada (855) and Bashkum (816) communities.

Figure 2: Five most common last sub-districts of departure of IDP arrivals (# IDPs)

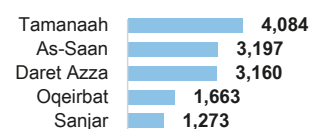
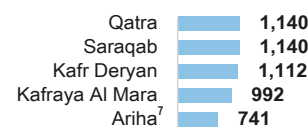


Figure 3: Five ISMI-covered communities receiving largest IDP arrivals (# IDPs)



ALEPPO GOVERNORATE (A'zaz sub-district)

Between 1 and 15 November, 1,289 IDPs arrived to ISMI-covered communities in Aleppo governorate in A'zaz sub-district, the majority of whom to Shamarin (935) community (Figure 6). Meanwhile, 468 IDPs were recorded departing ISMI-covered communities in A'zaz sub-district, all of whom from Shamarin (234) and Shmarekh (228) communities.

Figure 4: Aleppo sub-district receiving IDP arrivals (# IDPs)

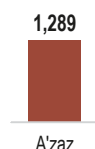


Figure 5: Most common last sub-districts of departure of IDP arrivals (# IDPs)

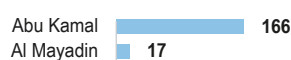
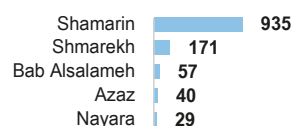


Figure 6: Five ISMI-covered communities receiving largest IDP arrivals (# IDPs)

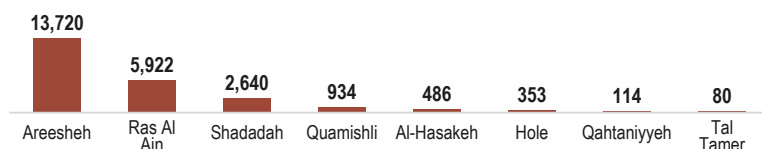

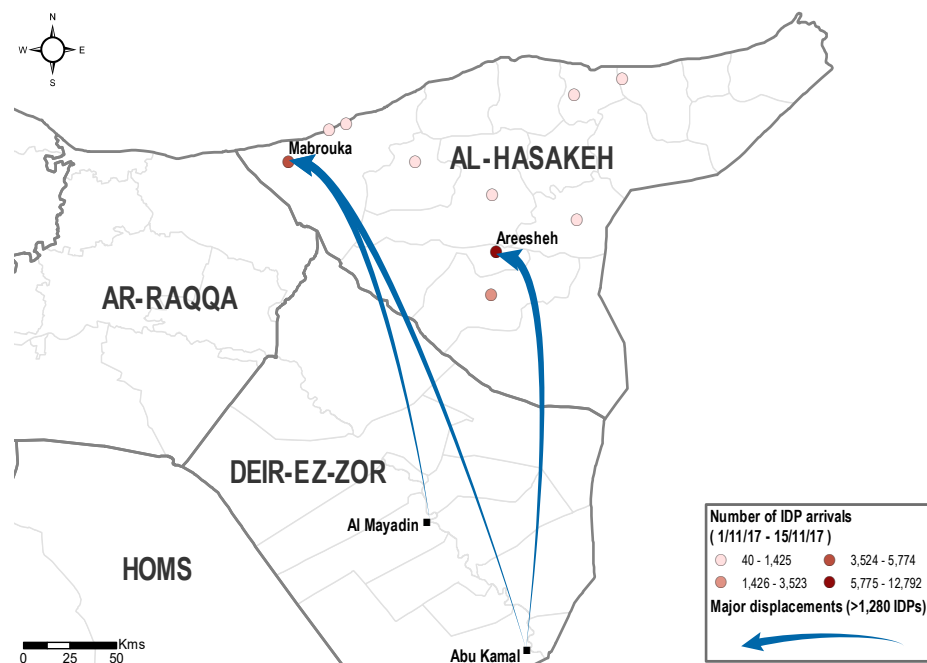
AL-HASAKEH GOVERNORATE

Between 1 and 15 November, ISMI-covered communities in Al-Hasakeh governorate witnessed the arrival of 24,249 IDPs, most commonly to Areesheh (13,720), Ras Al Ain (5,922) and Shadadah (2,640) sub-districts (Figure 7). Meanwhile, 27,358 IDPs left ISMI-covered communities in Al-Hasakeh, with the vast majority from Areesheh camp (8,327), Mabrouka camp (8,322), Ash-Shaddady council (2,697), Makhroum council (2,525) and Abofas council (2,525) communities.

Figure 8: Five most common last sub-districts of departure of IDP arrivals (# IDPs)

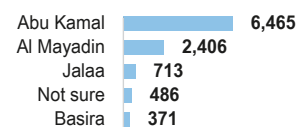
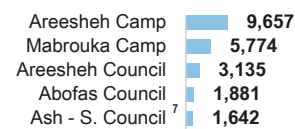


Figure 9: Five ISMI-covered communities receiving largest IDP arrivals (# IDPs)



About ISMI & This Factsheet

The IDP Situation Monitoring Initiative (ISMI) is an initiative of the Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) Cluster, implemented by REACH and supported by other cluster members.

Following a baseline assessment conducted between 23 October and 21 November 2016, weekly/bi-weekly data collection cycles have been initiated to provide regular updates on IDP movements. Based on 602 communities in the governorates of Aleppo (A'zaz sub-district), Al-Hasakeh and Idleb, this factsheet presents a summary of reported inward and outward movements of IDPs in the month of November 2017. **From 1 to 15 November 2017, such displacements were reported in 137 communities out of all ISMI-covered communities.**

Displacement was identified through an extensive key informant (KI) network, either through alerts initiated by KIs or follow-up by enumerators. A range of 2-3 KIs were interviewed in each community, while collected information was further triangulated through other sources, including CCCM member data and humanitarian updates. This approach allows for regular updates on IDP movements at a community level across ISMI coverage areas. However, movement updates are limited to areas covered by ISMI and there are, therefore, displacements that are not reported here.
