2. Rationale

2.1 Background

Endemic poverty and decades of conflict coupled with COVID-19, natural disasters, recent political transitions and subsequent humanitarian programming/economic constraints escalated need across Afghanistan. Concurrent to the withdrawal of foreign troops from Afghanistan, active conflict escalated from May 2021 onward across the country which concomitantly stifled economic activities and drove displacement. In parallel, the former Afghan government declared a drought across 80% of the country in June 2021 which further impeded agricultural and livestock economic activities. Separately, reported COVID-19 cases spiked from May – July 2021 and from November 2021 - February 2022 - coeval with a pause in funding for the World Health Organization (WHO)-led Sehatmandi project that provides healthcare services across the country. The four districts selected were directly impacted by conflict, displacement, drought and COVID-19 waves.

As part overall efforts to encourage a rolling needs identification process in Afghanistan and in recognition of the complexity/rapidity of the present context, the purpose of this RNA is to provide the ICCT with a) an appraisal of existing information gaps; and b) capture the current humanitarian needs and vulnerabilities in the four districts.

2.2 Intended impact

Findings will inform communications between humanitarian actors and Afghan communities. In addition, this RNA is intended to inform Inter-Cluster Coordination Team's (ICCT) planning and strategy on the recent assessed displacements.

3. Methodology

3.1 Methodology overview

This Rapid Needs Assessment utilizes a mixed method approach relying primarily on quantitative analysis of Key Informants Interviews (KIIs) and qualitative Focus Group Discussions (FGDs). Both the Key Informant (KI) pool and FGD participants included, among others, community elders, shopkeepers, small businessmen, public officials, and members of the clergy. KI and FGD participants are selected on the basis of their knowledge of their community, local geography, and local affairs. The districts and their KI portion are as follows. In rural Guzara, REACH interviewed 12 KIs. In Herat district, REACH interviewed 30 KIs, 62% of whom live in rural areas, 33% in peri-urban areas, and 3% in rural areas. In the Injil district, REACH interviewed 24 KIs, 63% of whom live peri-urban areas and 37% in rural areas. In the Kunduz province, only the Kunduz district was assessed. Of the 52 KI's interviewed, 52% reside in rural areas, 25% in peri-urban areas, and 23% in urban areas. All interviews were conducted remotely by phone through a call centre staffed by experienced enumerators from Kabul who are fluent speakers of Dari and Pashto.

Citing lack of safety stemming from the conflict, no FGD will be conducted in Guzara. The number of FGD participants will oscillate between 4 – 5 per FGD. In total, in the Herat province, REACH conducted 4 FGDs with 18 participants. In Kunduz, an additional 4 FGDs with 19 participants took place. Participants will be asked to engage in participatory mapping, thus adding a qualitative advantage that could not be obtained through the KI tool. The FGDs will be conducted in person.

3.2 Population of interest

This assessment targets IDPs and host communities in selected area in Herat and Kunduz provinces. IDPs are defined as "individuals or groups of people who have been forced out of their homes or places of habitual residence by armed conflict, situations of generalized violence, violations of human rights, and natural or artificially induced disasters and who have not crossed an international border." Host communities are defined as "individuals or groups of people currently residing in the communities of origins." This refers to populations who have not been displaced but also to those who were previously displaced but have since returned to their communities of origin. The assessed areas were selected for two main reasons: (1) these areas were relatively free of conflict when displacement commenced in May 2021 or in the 3-month period set as

an objective maximum threshold for the data collection. (2) Guzara, Herat, Injil, and Kunduz attracted a high influx of IDPs who fled the conflict in their areas of origin.

3.3 Secondary data review

To determine the four districts assessed, this assessment partially relies on the <u>IOM Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM)</u> Settlement Population estimates

To contextualise RNA findings, analysis will be triangulated with other external sources during output production. These sources include:

- World Bank Disaster Risk Profile: Afghanistan

3.4 Primary Data Collection

Data collection will rely on two tools:

- 1) A structured KII tool with closed-ended questions which is then uploaded to KoBo and all the responses directly inputted into the KoBo application by enumerators. The interviews will be conducted remotely by phone through a call centre staffed by experienced enumerators from Kabul. These are fluent speakers of Dari and Pashto. KIIs with 118 KIIs will be conducted in the Guzara, Herat, and Injil districts of Herat and in the Kunduz district of Kunduz province. Individuals will be selected based on their extensive knowledge of their respective communities i.e., community leaders, religious leaders, government officials, health workers or educators.
- 2) A semi-structured Focus Group Discussion tool with open-ended questions determining areas of concern, priority needs, IDP/host experiences related to IDP movement in the assessed areas. Separately, there will be a participatory mapping exercise to map IDP movements. FGD's will be conducted in person in Dari or Pashto. REACH will also conduct 8 Focus Group Discussions in the districts of Kunduz, Herat and Injil. Citing an insecure and unsafe situation the field operations did not conduct any FGDs in Guzara. FGD participants will be selected on the basis of their extensive knowledge of their respective communities i.e., community leaders, religious leaders, government officials, health workers or educators.

3.5 Data Processing & Analysis

Throughout data collection, cleaning will take place daily to maintain the high standard of the assessment. Across all data collection types, data cleaning and verification will take place every morning. Feedback will be provided directly to the enumerator by their immediate supervisor following consultations between the Assessment, Data and Operations. Data quality checking using the IMPACT Data Cleaning Minimum Standards Checklist will be used to outline the process and criteria for data deletion and determine staff responsibilities. Data cleaning will focus on identifying outliers in the data, contradictory or unlikely response options, and suspicious patterns from enumerators. A cleaning log of all changes will be kept and will be available upon request after the REACH publication of datasets.

To address information gaps within the humanitarian community in Afghanistan, data may be disaggregated by key informant sex, district assessed, province assessed and urban vs. rural.

FGD Rules

- 1. The most important rule is that only one person speaks at a time. You may be tempted to weigh in or respond to someone's comments, but please wait until they have finished.
- 2. There are no wrong answers but rather differing points of view. We are interested in your views and experiences. Please feel free to share your point of view even when it differs from that of the other participants. Keep in mind that we're just as interested in negative comments as positive comments, and, at times, negative comments are also helpful.
- 3. You do not have to speak in any particular order but will be called upon once the person who is already talking has finished.
- 4. When you do have something to say, please do so. There are many of you in the group and it is important that I obtain each and every view.

INSTRUCTIONS TO MODERATORS

- 2. **Probing questions:** Probes and clarifying questions are an important part of interviewing. These have two main purposes: 1) To help clarify what an interview respondent has said and 2) To help get more detailed information on topics of interest. Probes allow the interview respondent to provide more than just a one-sentence, or a yes or no, answer to the questions you ask. Do not read probing questions together with the questions to participants. Use or adapt them as necessary.

ARCHITECTURE AND ROUTE OF QUESTIONS

FIRST: AREA OF KNOWLEDGE: PARTICIPATORY MAPPING

To read to participants: In this section we will ask you about the settlement that was your family area of residence in the last 3 months (since Eid al-Fitr), before displacing to your current location.

- Question 1. Please find your village on the map. Also identify the major towns, rivers, and roads on the maps in pen.
 - O Please identify and mark any mountains/slopes, rivers, or floodplains on the map, and mark in pen.
 - o Identify any Fields, pastures or forests on the map, and mark in pen.
 - o Identify the main or secondary roads, and mark in pen
 - o Identify any major markets/bazaars, mosques, health centers, and schools. Mark and label all of them on the map.
 - ★ Locate on maps: farm and grazing lands, schools, health centers, mosques, markets, infrastructure necessary for needs assessments. Also consider the season of displacement and whether this falls on tilling or harvesting crops season etc., or not. (If displacement occurs on harvesting season, then livelihoods are severely impacted)
- Question 2: Did your community experienced natural hazard events, like drought, floods, earthquakes, or infestation of locust/insects in the past 3 months?
 - o How did this event impact your community? Did it cause displacement? How did the community respond?
 - o Has there been any change in level or type of impact in the past 30 days?
 - o How often do these events happen? (For example, every year, every 2 years, etc.)
 - O What do you typically do when these events happen? Where do you go?
- Question 3: How safe did you feel in your community? Have there been any security or conflict incidents that made you concerned for yours or your family's safety in the past 3 months?
 - O What do you usually do when these incidents happen?
 - o Has there been any change in level or type of impact in the past 30 days?

SECOND: PUSH FACTORS: PARTICIPATORY MAPPING

To read to participants: In this section we will ask you about the reasons for leaving your family area of residence in the last 3 months (since Eid al-Fitr), before displacing to your current location, and its impact on your household.

- Question 1: What is the main reason that you left your home area?
 - O When did you leave your home?

Note to moderators: If the reasons are natural hazard or connected to geography at any level, do not hesitate to link the answer here to the SECOND: AREA OF KNOWLEDGE above. Go back and refer it to it as often as possible for better links.

- o How did your displacement impact your overall household situation?
 - How did that impact your crops?
 - How did that impact the livestock?
 - How did that impact your shelter?
 - How did that impact livelihoods?
- Question 2: Did you lose any assets in your displacement (shelter, crops, livestock, vehicle)?
 - o What did you lose? What do you still have? **Note:** Do not ask about any loss of life or family members, only material assets and possessions.
- ⇒ THIRD: DISPLACEMENT AND FLOW ROUTES: PARTICIPATORY MAPPING,

Note: this is largely the same as the SECOND: AREA OF KNOWELDGE. The purpose is to geolocate routes that the displaced took after leaving their area of origin.

To read to participants: In this section we will ask you about the routes taken to displace to this current location, as well as the displacement trends of other households from your previous area of family residence.

- Question 1: What route did you take after you left your home area? Please mark on the map the route that you took to get from your previous home to your current location.
 - o Please note any mountains, roads, rivers, or other geographic features that you passed through or over on your journey.
- Question 2: Did you stop somewhere to stay first before coming here?
 - o If so, why did you choose to stay there?
 - O Why did you leave the location?
 - Were there tensions with the host community?
 - Were there not enough livelihoods opportunities?
 - Were there insufficient services there that made life difficult?
 - Was the location dangerous?

Question 3: What methods of transport did you use to come from your home area to this location?

- O Did you use a vehicle? Who owned the vehicle?
- o Did you use a boat or ferry? Who owned it?
- o Did you travel by camel or donkey for any part of the way? Whose camel or donkey was it?

- Did you have to walk any part of the way?
- O How much did you have to pay to come from your home area to this location?
- Question 4: Did you come here as a group, or did you need to divide into separate groups?
 - O Approximately how many households left at around the same time?
 - O Did any households leave before you? If yes, approximately how many?
 - o Did any households leave after you? If yes, approximately how many?
 - o Did anyone stay behind in your home area? If yes, why? And approximately how many?
 - If so, are they planning to join you here?
 - Question 5: Did anyone from your home area go anywhere else? If so, where did they go? (please mark on the map)
 - o If you know, please say approximately when they left and how many households?
 - o If you know, please explain why they went there and not here?

⇒ FOURTH: AREA OF CURRENT LOCATION: PARTICIPATORY MAPPING

Note, this section should emphasize pull factors as well as measure future intentions beyond the current location.

To read to participants: In this section we will ask you about your current area: the reasons you chose to displace to this specific location, current conditions in the area for you and your community, and movement intentions in the coming months.

- Question 1: Why did you come to this location, and not other places?
 - O When did you arrive here?
 - o Did you come here for better livelihoods opportunities/it was easier to get a job?
 - o Did you come here because it was safer?
 - o Did you come here because you have family or friends here who could support you?
 - O What other reasons did you come here and not other places?
- Question 2: Have you received any humanitarian assistance since arriving in this location?
 - o If so, what have you received?
- Question 3: Are you free to move safely in this location? Do you feel like your freedom of movement is restricted?
 - o Is the ability to move safely in this location different for men and women? If so, how?
- Question 4: How long do you plan to stay in this location?
 - o If you plan to leave at any point, why do you plan to leave?
 - o If you plan to leave at any point, where do you plan to go?

• Do you plan to return to your home? Under what conditions do you plan to return? (Obtain answers "why" for each term)

Note: Reasons for staying/leaving may include family, access to shelter, access to land, access to livelihoods and job opportunities, access to key services, or any other reason.
