
Summary

There was no Blanket Supplementary Feeding distribution in the past month since CSB+ was not available. Other heath activities are ongoing like screening for malunitrition and a Handicap International one month training resulting on the selection of 6 attendees form PoC1 and 3 to work with the community providing counselling.
