Collective Site Monitoring Methodology, Round 18

- Collective Site Monitoring is a **quarterly research cycle** aimed at obtaining the latest data on the situation in collective sites to inform the humanitarian response.
- Data collection method: key informant interviews (KIIs) **with collective site managers**.
- Round 18: **23 August - 5 September 2025**.
- **1,382** collective sites surveyed, of which **95%** were hosting IDPs at the time of interview.
- **63,850 people** were staying in the collective sites surveyed in Round 18.

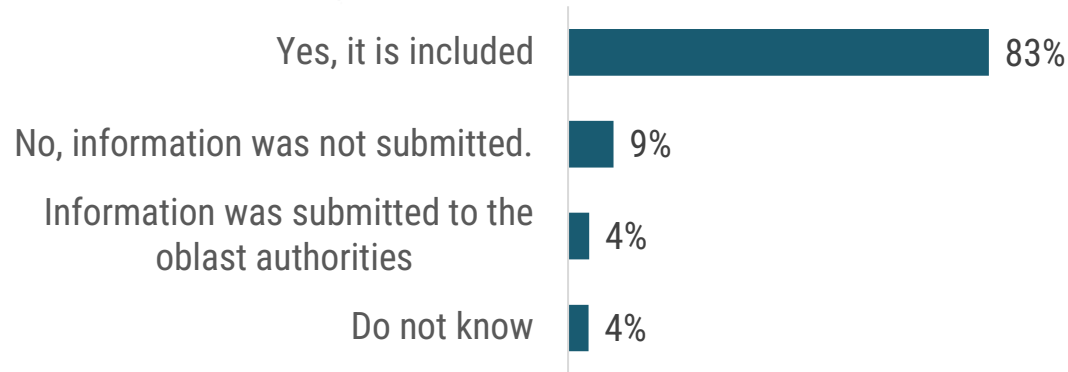


Most frequently reported reasons for settling into CSs (among those who arrived in the last three months) :

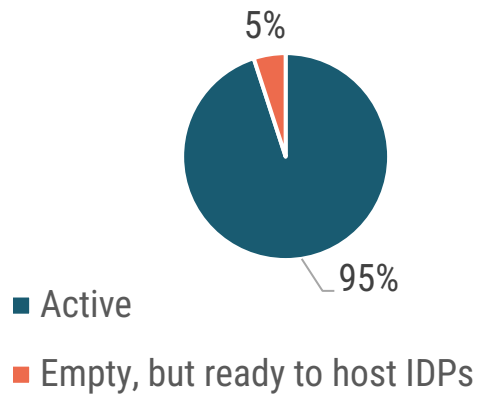
- Settlement too close to the frontline (64%)
- Housing is destroyed or damaged (47%)
- Cannot afford renting (43%)

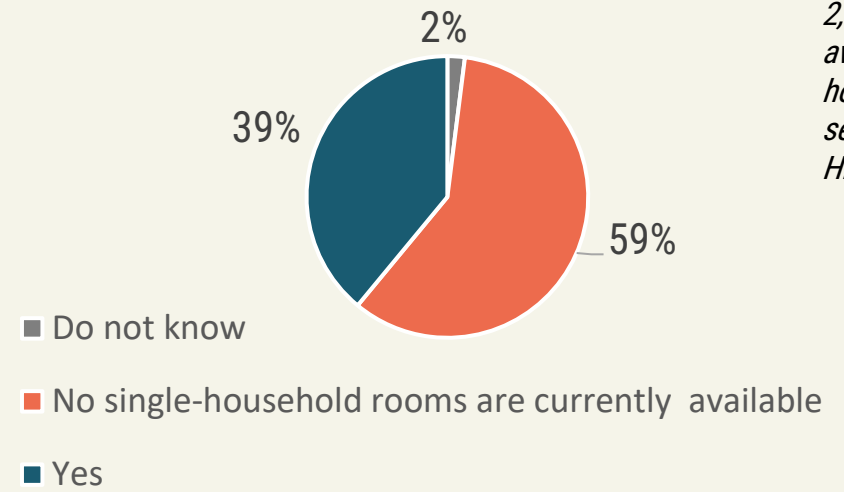
Inclusion of the site in the list of CSs approved by oblast authorities (Resolution №930), % of CSs



Site activity status, % of CSs

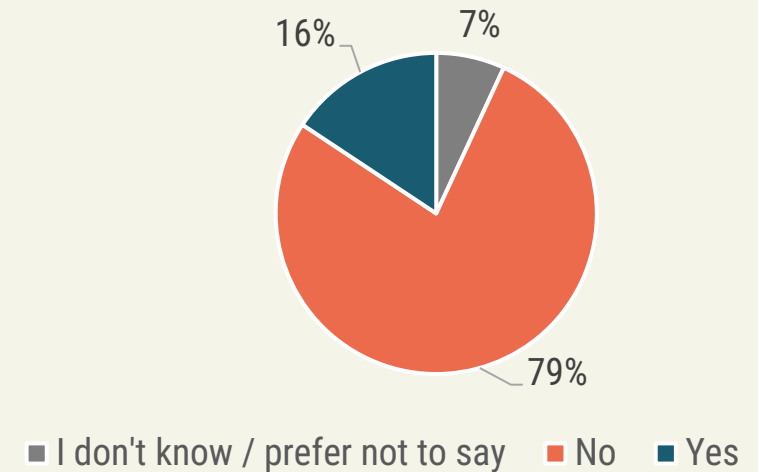


Number of vacant single-household rooms available for separate IDP households, % of CSs

Collective Site Management and Compensation for Utilities



91% of the CSs reportedly **have enrollment and exit system** for new arrivals and departures.



94% **consult with the residents** when making decisions concerning their collective site

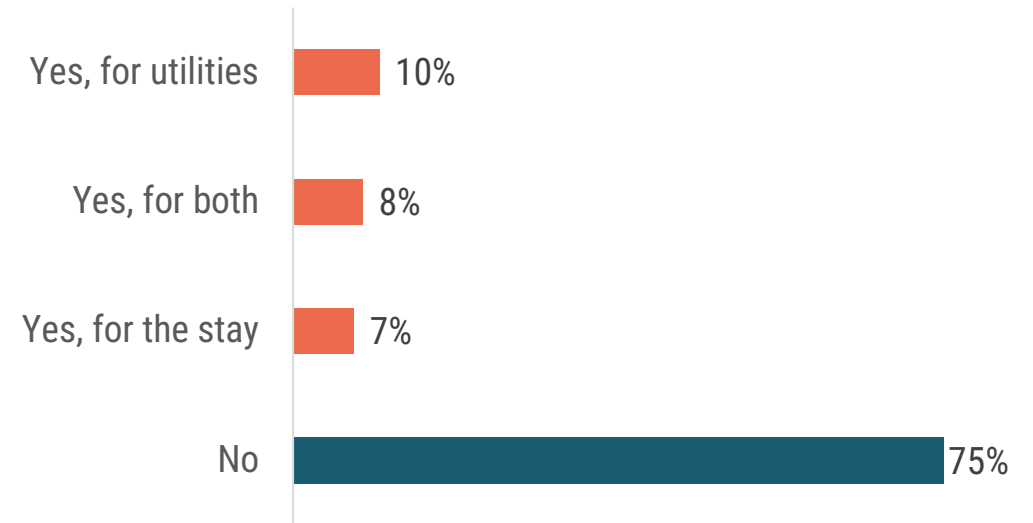


88% **signed contracts with IDPs** to define terms of hosting



94% **rules of stay** established in writing on site.

Charges for stay and/or utilities, % of CSs



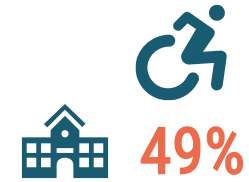
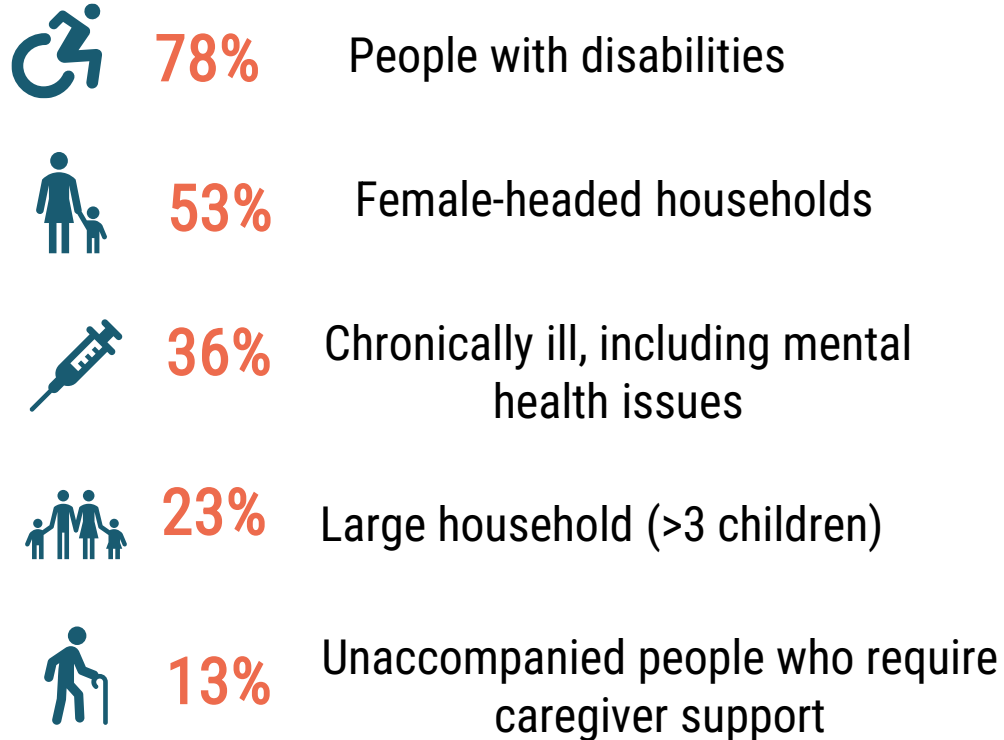

62% of CSs reported receiving compensation for utility bills from state budget (Resolution №261, №616)

Of surveyed CS indicated lack of disability-friendly infrastructure (except WASH) (elevators, external ramps, horizontal bars on doors)



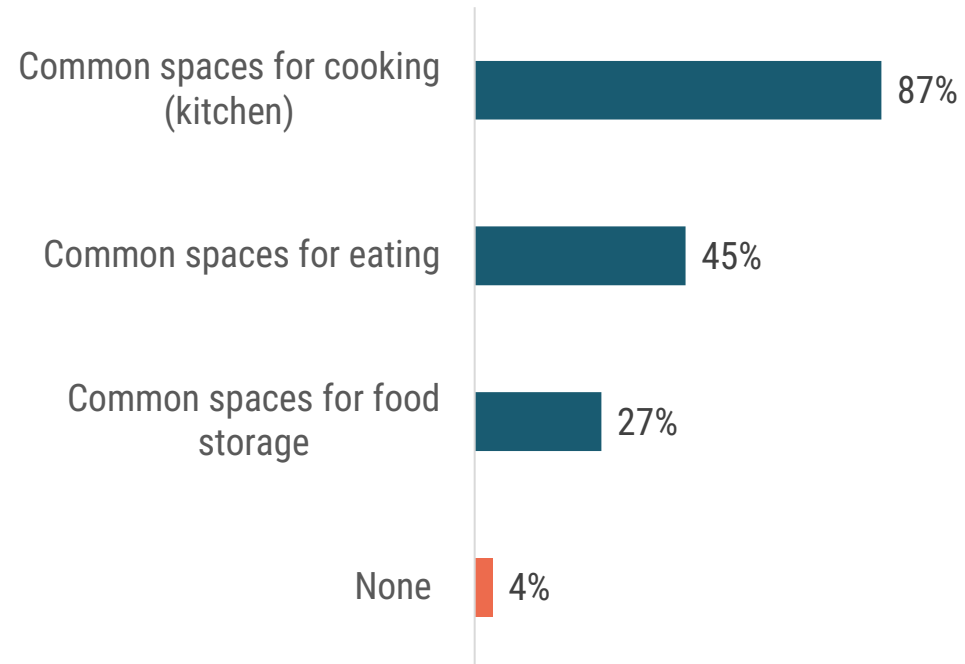
Of surveyed CS indicated lack of disability-friendly toilets



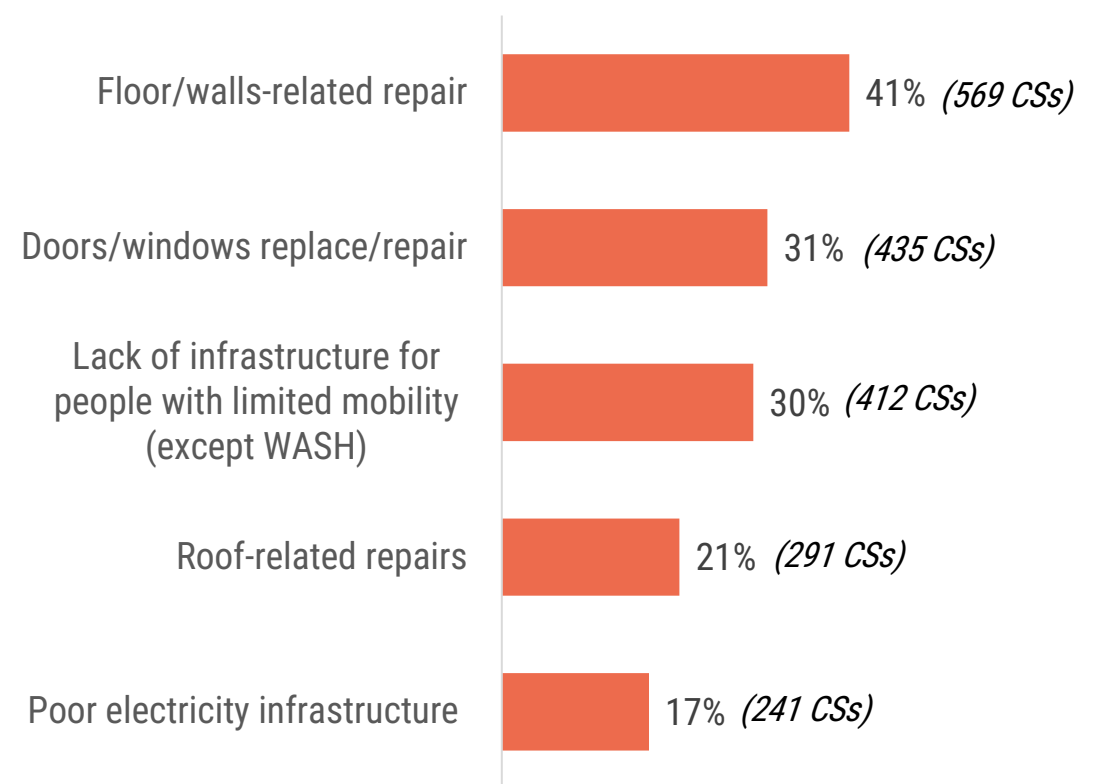

Lack of bomb shelters in the facility itself or nearby (500 meters away).

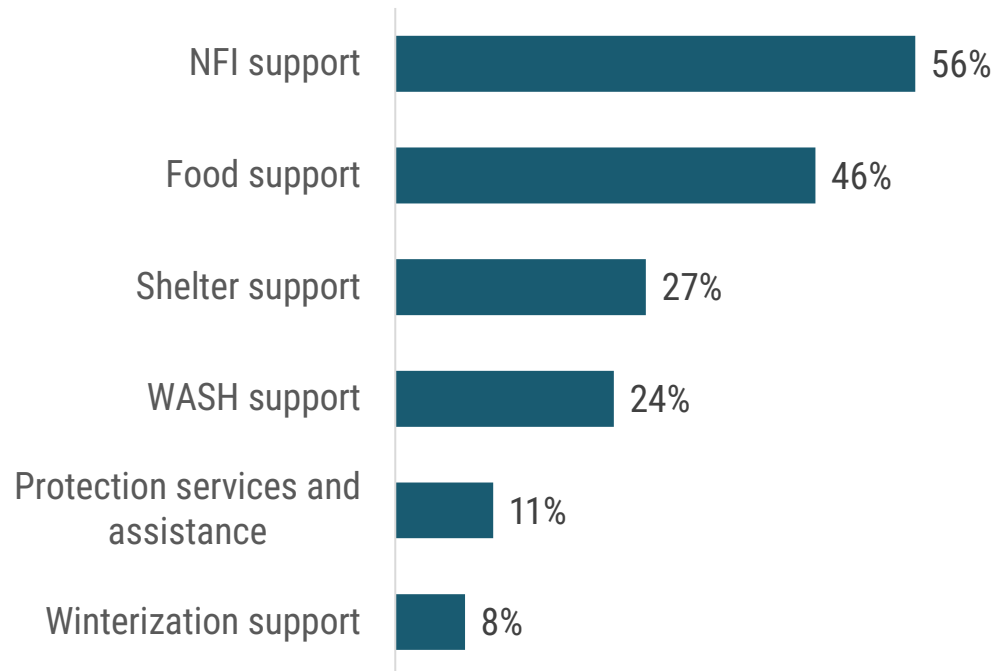

Bomb shelters were reported as not accessible for people with disabilities/reduced mobility

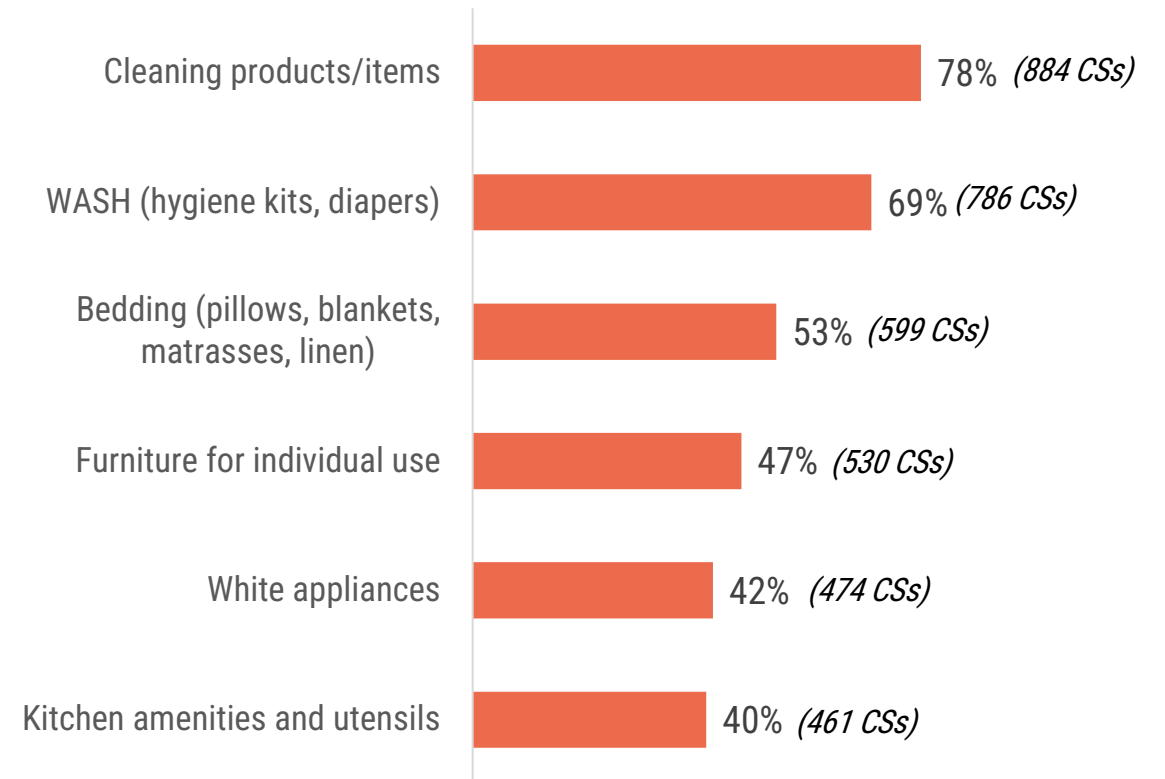
Humanitarian Assistance and NFI Needs

 **35%** of the CS managers reported receiving humanitarian assistance in the past three months.

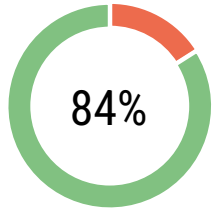
Assistance received within last three months, % of CSs



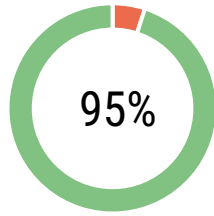
NFI Needs in the Collective Site, % of CSs



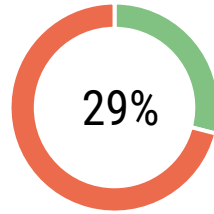

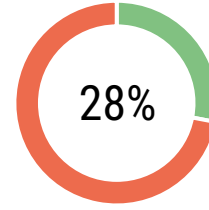
Privacy of bathing facilities, % of CSs

Separation of toilets by gender, % of CSs



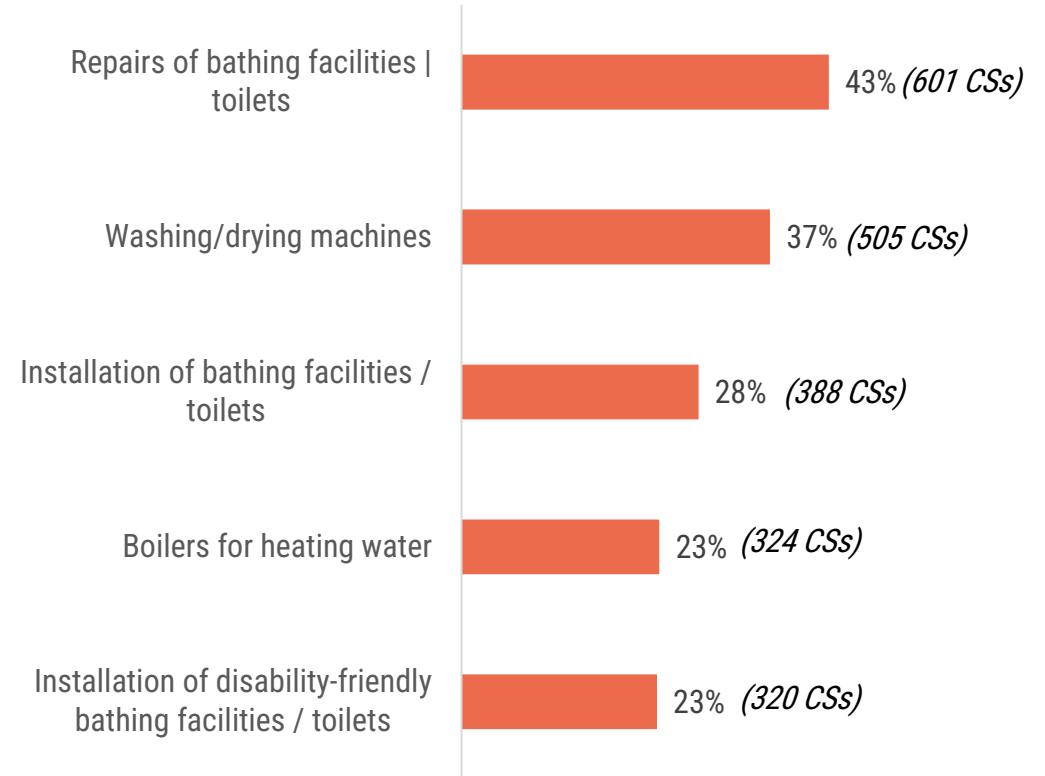
Separation of bathing facilities by gender, % of CSs

28% of the CSs reportedly had **disability-friendly** bathing facilities and toilets and **29%** - disability-friendly toilets.

69% of CSs indicated the need for **WASH items**.

15% of the CSs reported the lack of hot water availability.

Winterization



Only 8% of the collective sites reported receiving winterization support in the past three months.



46% of the collective sites reported a lack of an **alternative source of heating on site.**

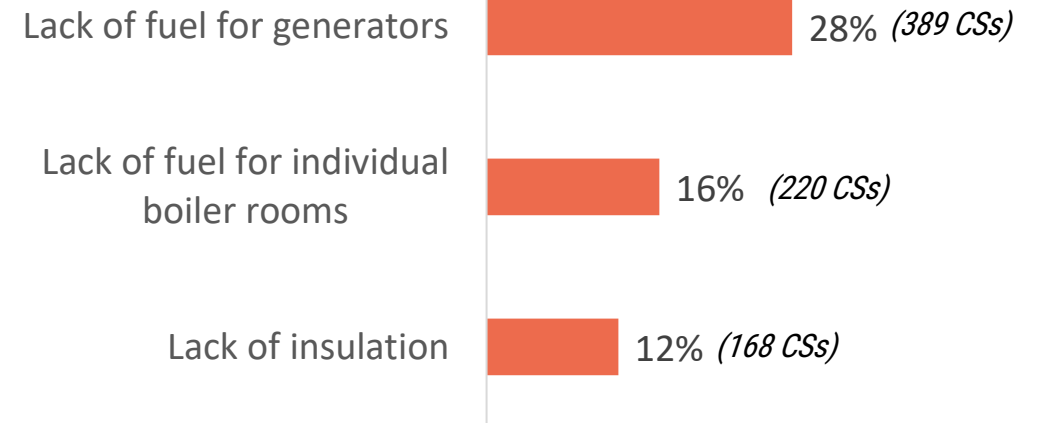


23% of the collective sites indicated a lack of **back up source of power.**



46% of the collective sites reported that **fuel** is needed for individual boiler rooms for the heating season.

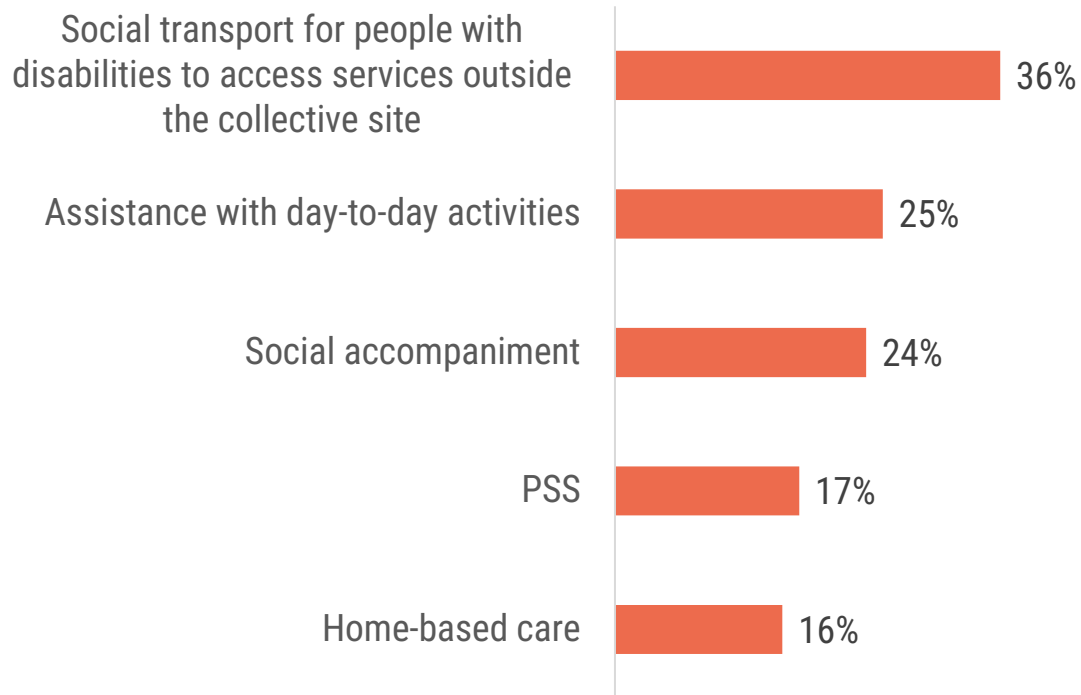
Top-3 winterization needs, % of CSs



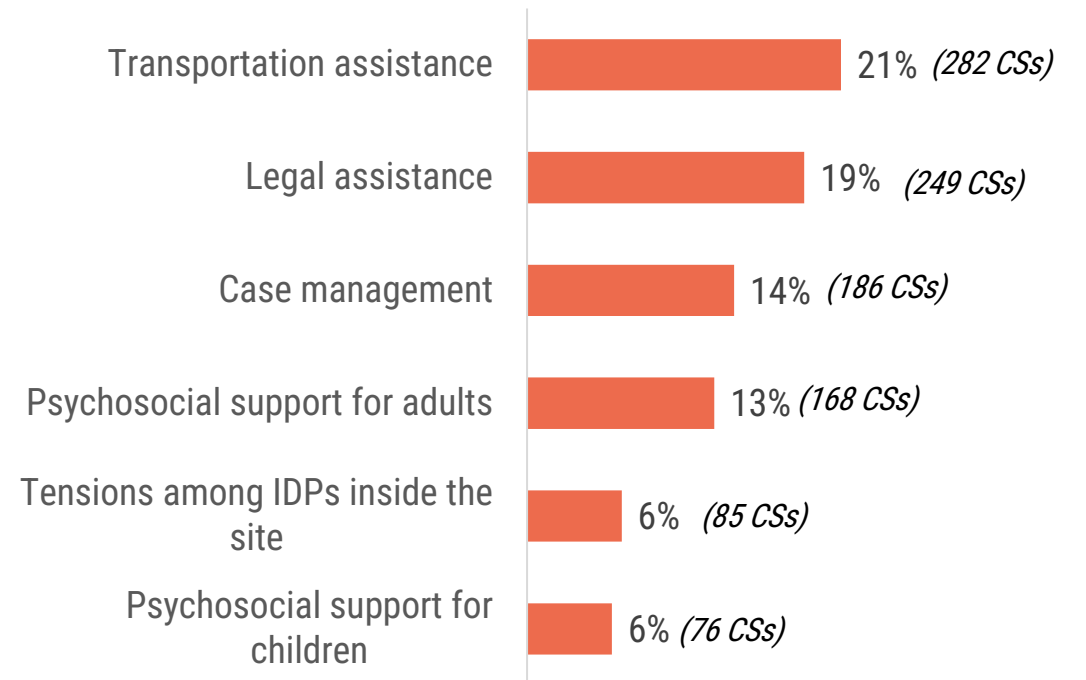
Protection Needs

 **44%** of surveyed collective sites reported having protection concerns and/or needs.

Most commonly reported missing social services, % of CSs

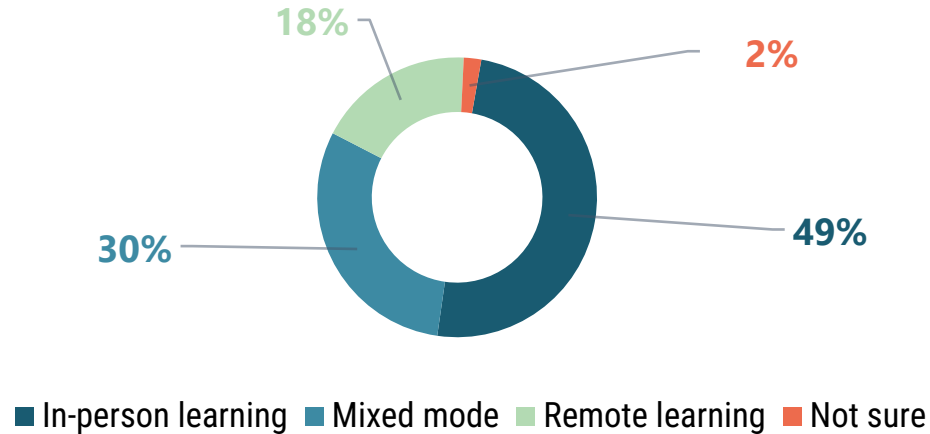


Most commonly reported protection concerns/needs, % of CSs



Healthcare, Educational and Other Public Services

Predominant reported mode of education for schoolchildren living in CSs, % of CSs

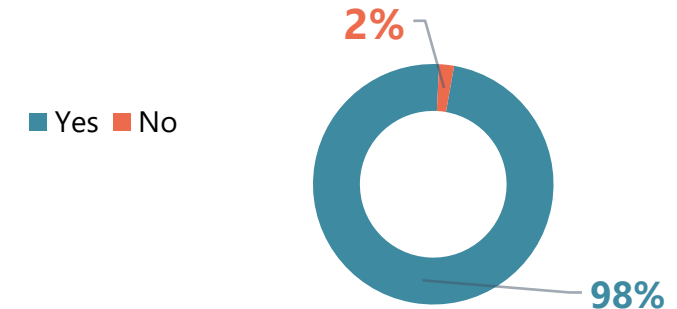


95% schools and kindergartens near the site with available places to enroll children.

13% Reported at least one barrier for children in terms of access to education. (The most common barriers were the **lack of a separate space in the CS for distance learning (7%)**).

9% of the CSs reported the lack of availability of first aid kits at the site.

Availability of primary healthcare facilities near the site (up to 30 minute drive via public transport)



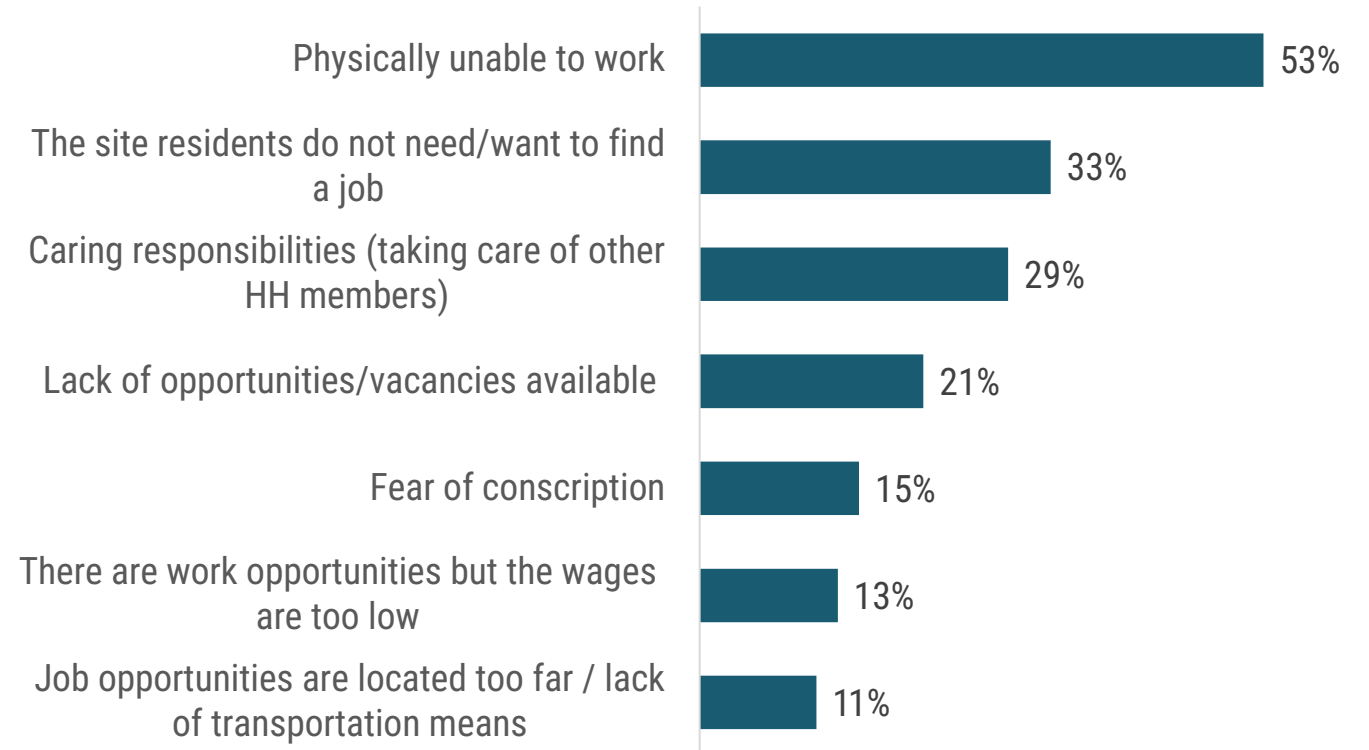
36% of the CSs reported hosting chronically ill, including persons with mental health issues

78% of the CSs reported hosting people with disabilities

Employment

Approximately half (48%) of the working-age site residents (18-59 y/o) were reportedly employed.

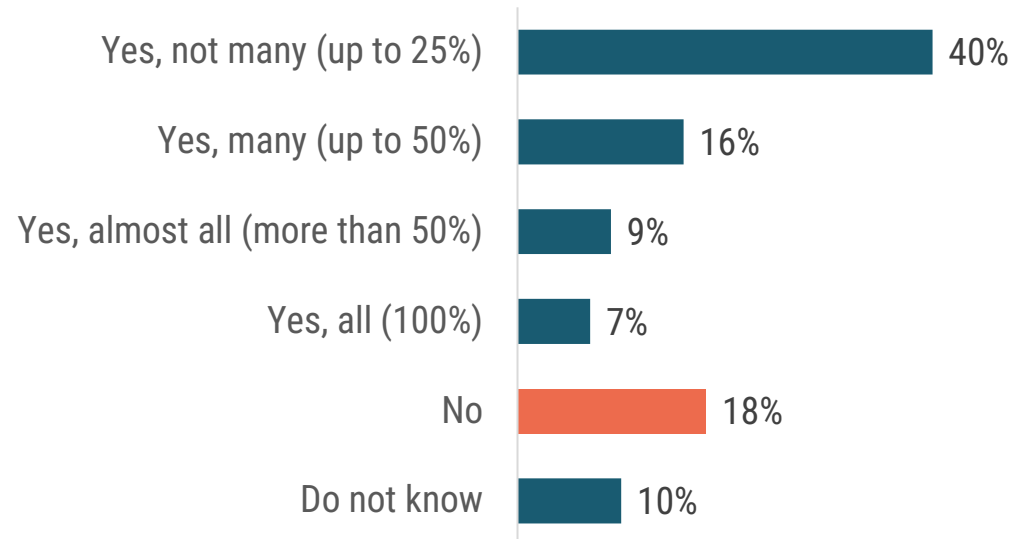
Main reasons for unemployment among working-age site residents, % of CSs



Livelihoods and Social Cohesion

47% of the site managers described relationship between site residents and the host community, as very good, and **35%** as relatively good.

Participation in social activities in the host community, % of CSs



Most frequently reported reasons why site residents do not participate in social activities:

- Age, illness or disability (54%)
- Lack of interest (52%)
- Lack of time (29%)
