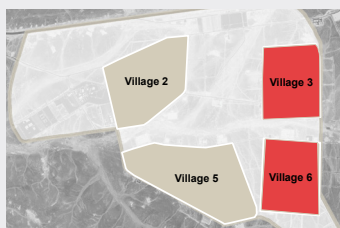
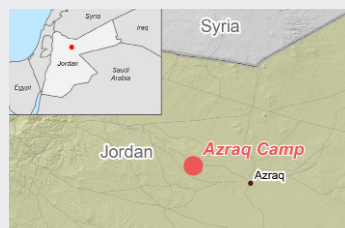


Azraq Camp - Zarqa Governorate, Jordan

Context

This REACH assessment aimed to quantify usage and levels of satisfaction with public leisure spaces among Azraq Camp residents. Its findings are statistically representative at the camp- and village level.

High levels of satisfaction with public leisure spaces were found in both villages. However, there was a noticeable difference in the usage of public leisure spaces between Village 3 and 6. Almost twice as many residents in Village 3 (41%) than Village 6 (22%) reported that they did not visit any type of public leisure space.

Use of public leisure spaces

The proportion of the population in each village that visited each type of public leisure space across villages.

Access for girls to public leisure spaces

- Residents that had lived in the camp for less than one month were excluded from the study.
- A majority (59%) of residents had lived in the camp for less than six months.
- The largest proportion (28%) of residents had lived in the camp for six months.
