Summary

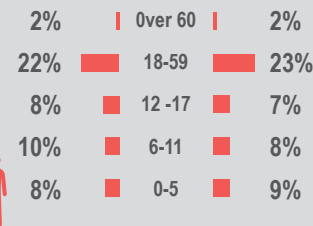
