# Askira/Uba LGA WASH Baseline - Key Findings

Borno State, Nigeria

September 2017

REACH, in partnership with the Nigeria WASH Sector and Global WASH Cluster carried out a baseline assessment on WASH related vulnerabilities amongst Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), returnees and non-displaced populations in multiple Local Government Area (LGA) capitals in Borno State. This factsheet provides an overview of key findings from the WASH baseline assessment.

Findings are based on data collected through a household level survey between 22-24 September 2017. A total of 338 randomly selected households in Askira/Uba LGA were interviewed. Findings can be generalised to the LGA capital population with a 95% confidence level and a 9% margin of error.



### Water

**66%** of IDP, **85%** of non-displaced, and **67%** of returnee housholds in Askira/Uba LGA reported sufficient access to water<sup>1</sup> in the past 30 days to meet household needs.

### Main coping mechanisms<sup>2</sup> reported for those without sufficient access:
