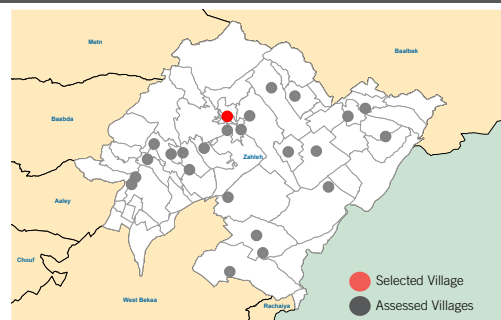

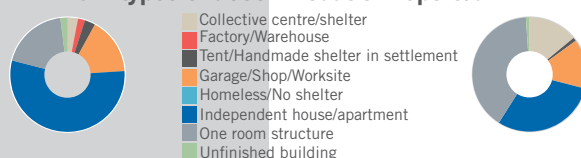

Kind of occupancy arrangement

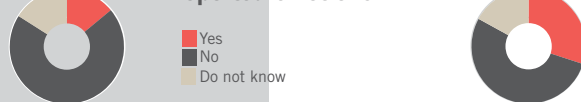

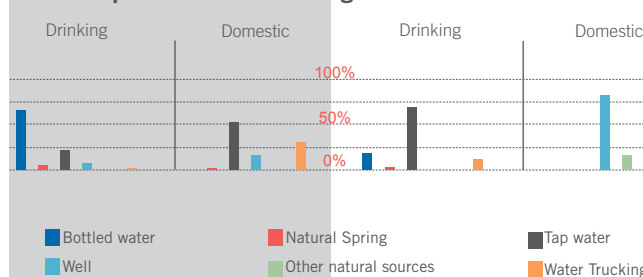

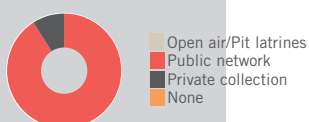

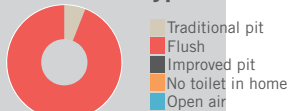

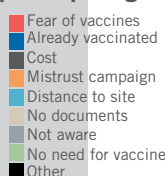
