


South Sudan: Humanitarian Situation Monitoring, April-May 2024 - Damaged shelters

Proportion of assessed settlements where key informants reported shelters being severely damaged or destroyed in the 30 days prior to data collection

Production date: 19 August 2024



Methodology
 The Area of Knowledge (AoK) assessment is conducted every quarter using a structured survey with Key Informants (KIs) who have arrived from, recently visited, or received regular information from a settlement. All data was aggregated at the settlement level, and settlements were assigned the modal or most credible response. When no consensus was reached regarding a settlement, the report did not include that settlement.

To limit biases in sampling, Payamⁱ quota sampling was employed to ensure a geographic spread of settlements across and increase geographical representativeness. Data is displayed for counties that reached interview coverage of at least 10% of all settlements per countyⁱⁱ.

The data collection took place between the 08th of April and the 10th of May 2024, and a total of 4,077 KIs were interviewed in 3,229 settlements across South Sudan.

Furthermore, findings are not generalizable and should be considered indicative of the situation in assessed areas unless specified otherwise.

i. Payam is the administrative unit below the county-level.
 ii. To calculate the percentage of AoK coverage, the total number of settlements per county is based on OCHA settlement lists in addition to new settlements mapped by KIs reached each month.
