Summary

Bersive 2 IDP camp was established in November 2014 as a formal camp for internally displaced persons (IDPs) who had settled in the area. The main area of origin of the resident IDPs is Sinjar, Ninewa Governorate.

Primary data was collected through household surveys on 27 & 30/11/2014. Additional information from camp managers, marked (*) is correct as of 27/11/2014.

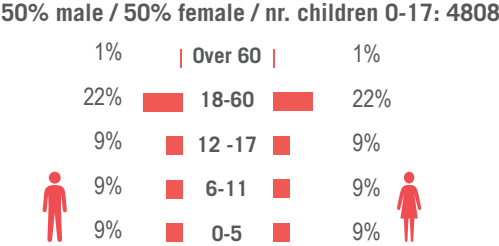

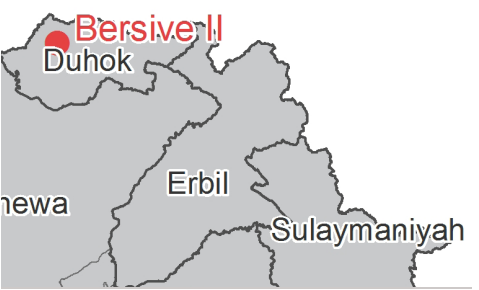

Key Developments

Tents in the camp have winterisation characteristics. All tents were raised on a concrete plinth and 99% had a secondary cover.

All households had received NFI assistance since the onset of the crisis. 34% had received hygiene kits, clothing was received by 29% and footwear by 16%.

One challenge faced in the camp is access to water. 26% said they had not had enough drinking water in the past two weeks to meet household needs. 32% said they did not have enough clean water for purposes other than drinking.

63% had received food assistance in the past month. 1% had received a food package composed of less than a Family Food Parcel (staple carbohydrates, dry pulses, oil, sugar and iodized salt).
