


MOZAMBIQUE - Beira City Manga Mascarenha - Unimproved Water Sources - As of 17 April 2019




**unimproved water sources are open wells, open water catchments and other unprotected water sources identified through a rapid infrastructure assessment of Beira by REACH. Other water sources are protected wells, motorized/hand pumped boreholes, tapstands, and municipal piped water. REACH was unable to map the piped water system due to its extent, so water analysis is focused on highlighting areas with unimproved sources.





