

Harshm Formal Camp Profile

Erbil Governorate, Iraq

Harshm IDP camp was established in September 2014 as a formal site for internally displaced persons (IDPs) who had settled in the area. The main areas of origin of the resident IDPs are Mosul, Hamdaniyah and Sinjar districts in Ninewa Governorate.

Primary data was collected through household surveys on 17 and 19/11/2014. Additional information from camp managers, marked (*) is correct as of 17/11/2014.



Key Developments

92% received NFI assistance since the onset of the crisis. 38% had received clothing, 25% hygiene kits and 17% footware.

77% of tents had a secondary cover. No tents were raised on a winterised plinth. 3% of assessed households reported having received shelter support in addition to the tent. 77 respondents reported accommodation issues. 50 reported presence of vectors, 47 that it was not secure, 37 reported damp and 32 reported there was a lack of heating.

30% had received a food package composed of less than a standard Family Food Parcel (staple carbohydrates, pulses, oil, sugar and iodized salt). 24% said they had not had enough drinking water in the past two weeks to meet their household needs.


