2. Rationale

2.1. Rationale

Close to 240,000 mostly Somali refugees reside in Dadaab camps and are vulnerable to pressure to return, despite the continued uncertain situation in Somalia. In Dadaab there is a growing number of "undocumented persons" who are unable to access refugee registration, largely suspended by the Government of Kenya since 2015. At least 4,600 asylum seekers, mostly of Somali origin (including returning refugees), have been recorded by UNHCR in 2017, but reports indicate that this number is likely much higher. In May 2017, NRC found that 9% of sampled households had no member of the household registered. The consequences for undocumented persons in Dadaab are severe as they are denied the basic humanitarian support given to registered refugees (with limited exceptions). They can only access basic healthcare within the camp and undocumented children have limited access to education services. It is in this context that REACH, in close coordination with UNHCR, NRC and other relevant IM actors in Dadaab, will lead a series of regular, household-level multi-sectoral needs assessments (MSNA) aimed at providing an up-to-date overview of living conditions in the camps.

3. Methodology

2.1. Methodology overview

REACH will use quantitative data collection method driven by a household-level tool and methodology developed through close coordination between UNHCR, sector leads, and partners to collect, multi-sectoral data on the needs among refugees living in Dadaab. The process will begin with a thorough analysis of secondary data. This will be followed by broad stakeholder consultation, which will be initiated ahead of the launch of data collection to inform, where relevant, design of indicators, tools and methodology.

Population of interest

The assessment will cover three refugee camps in Dadaab refugee complex; Dagahaley, Hagadera and IFO camps. The population of interest are refugees from Somalia and other countries living within the three refugee camps.

2.2. Secondary data review

- 1) UNHCR Monthly operational updates- This provides an overview of activities and service delivery carried out in the camps including WASH activities, education interventions, Health services as well as protection and security. The resource will help triangulate primary data that will be collected on needs and access to services in Dadaab as perceived by households.
- Sector specific assessments in Dadaab- This include food security assessments, education assessments as well
 as health surveys carried out by actors operating in Dadaab. These resources will aid in designing the methodology
 including tool development.

2.3. Primary Data Collection

The activity will be implemented through household-level assessments of each camp, targeting a representative household sample at camp level at 95% Confidence level and 10% Margin of Error. All sampling will be randomized to ensure statistical accuracy. Random GPS points will be generated in the residential areas, which are clearly divided into blocks and enumerators will interview households that fall on particular points. In case there is no one to interview in the selected household, or the respondent is unwilling to participate, enumerators will target the next nearest household. They will be guided by a mobile navigation application to target the points. The sample size will be calculated based on household population of each camp, which is already known (see table 1). The questionnaire will cover Levels of needs, access and vulnerabilities across the sectors of:

- 1. Protection,
- 2. Water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH),
- 3. Education
- 4. Food assistance
- 5. Health and nutrition
- 6. Shelter
- 7. Livelihoods and environment.

Data will be collected using ODK collect by use of mobile phones. Daily data checks will be conducted in the evening once enumerators have uploaded the data in the server. The outcomes of the data quality checks will be used as a basis for debriefing the enumerators before further data collection. Once all data have been uploaded, data cleaning will begin and feedback gathered where needed from enumerators.

2.4. Data Processing & Analysis

Primary data will be uploaded on the KOBO platform where it will be downloaded for cleaning and analysis. Data analysis shall be conducted on mutually established indicators using excel. Once initial data analysis has been done, the findings will be discussed and contextualized with relevant partners during a joint analysis workshop. One factsheet will be produced per camp covering such areas as demographics, displacement, returns, intentions as well as registration and documentation.
