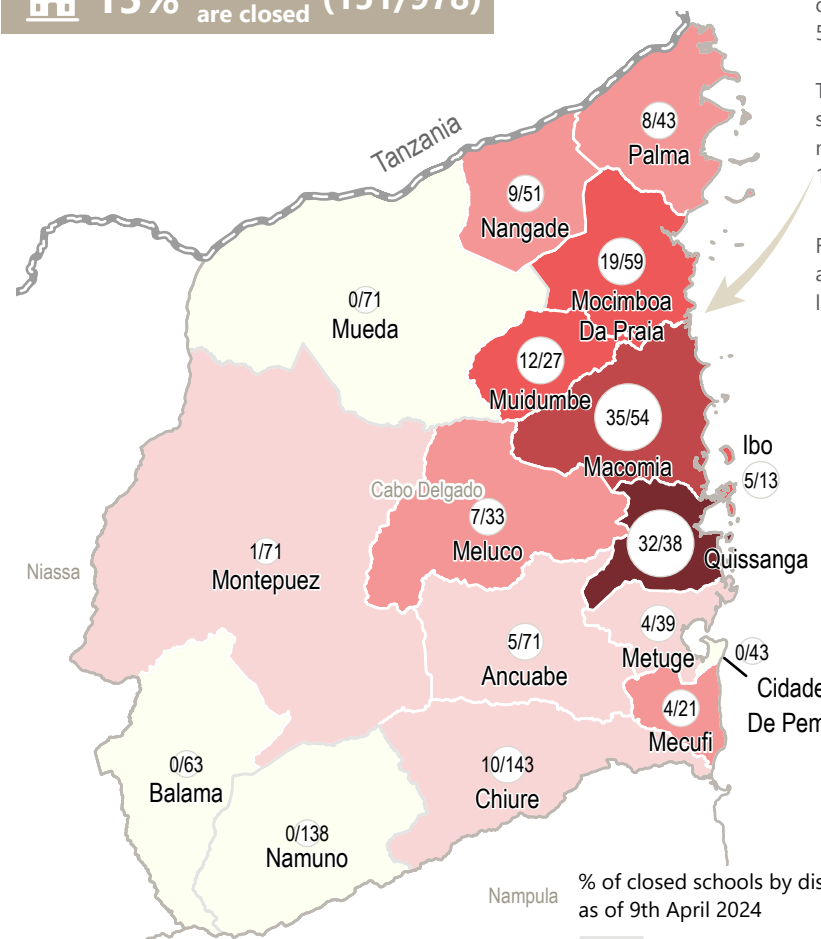
School Disruptions in Cabo Delgado in 2024

15% of schools are closed (151/978)

Cabo Delgado has experienced a significant increase in violence since the start of 2024, with major attacks by non-state armed groups (NSAG) in the districts of Chiure (April 2024) and Macomia (May 2024) that displaced more than 50,000 people.

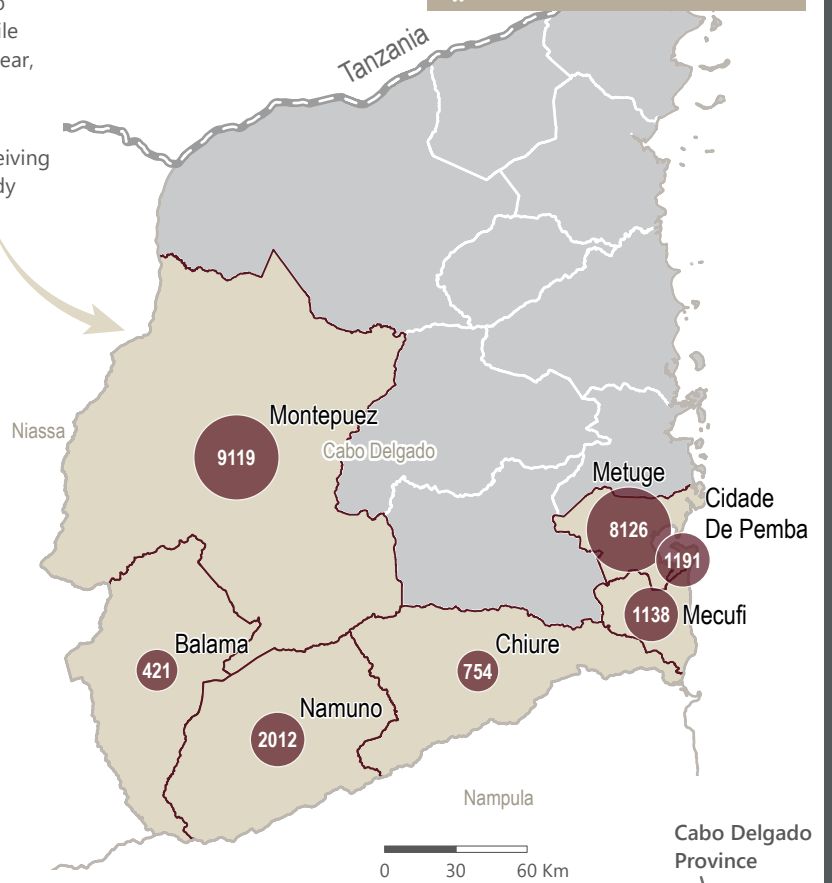
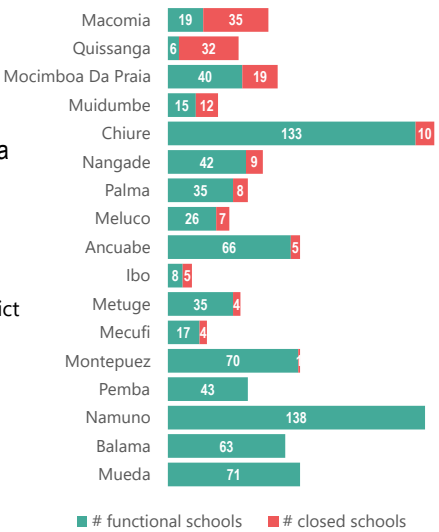
7 districts hosting IDPs

The violence and subsequent displacement has led to significant disruptions in schools in the province. While many schools have re-opened since the start of the year, 151 schools remain closed throughout the province.

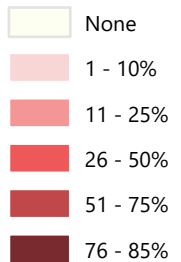
Furthermore, schools in less affected districts are receiving an influx of displaced students, stretching their already limited capacity.
