



Introduction: This map shows the priority needs identified by refugees based on a camp survey of 3,126 households by REACH in April 2014, those households account for 3,942 of the ration cards in the camp. This is 95% of all registered households and 98% of individuals expected to be living in Gendrassa. The tent layer is expected to be representative of the population distribution across the site because of the robust random sampling methodology used.

Methodology: The survey used a sample size of 3,126 households; with an official number of households of 4,138 this sample ensures a 99% level of confidence and a 1.2% margin of error. The map is showing an aggregation of responses – for privacy reasons, it does not display each household’s greatest need. **The polygons in this map should in no way be considered as a plot of land the household owns.**

Results: Security was the largest response with 55% of households, food was second with 32% of responses, the third most popular was water with 6.5% of responses. The other responses of education, employment, healthcare, other, and none (some not shown for low response) equalled 6.5% of responses.
