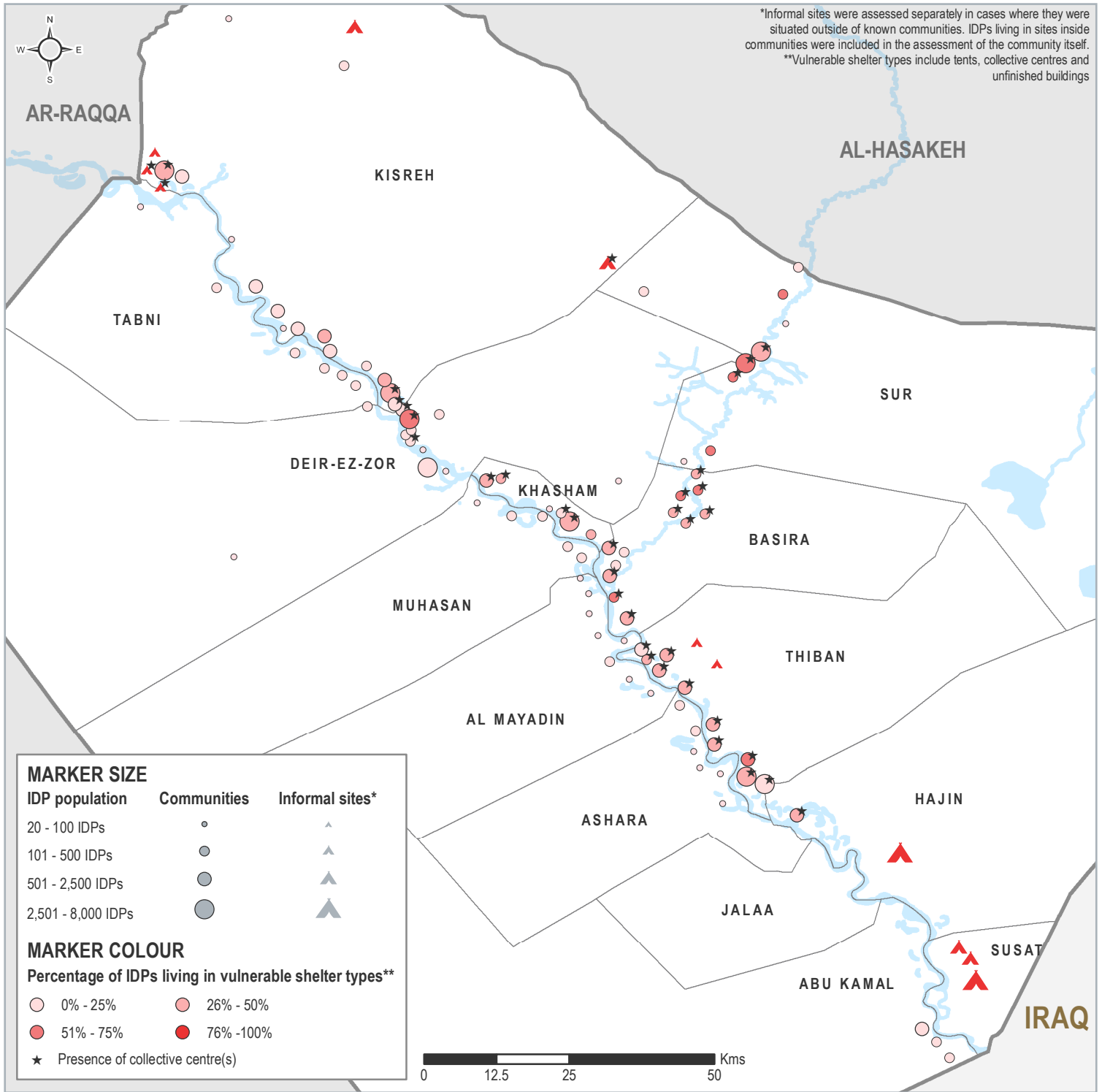
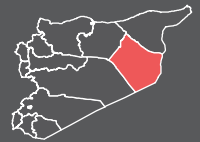




Deir-ez-Zor: IDP Shelter Conditions

Syria, June 2018



Key Findings

This map shows reported IDP numbers in assessed communities and the percentage living in vulnerable shelter types as well as the presence of collective centres.

- **Kisreh sub-district had both the highest number of reported IDPs and the highest estimated number living in vulnerable shelter types.** Susat, Hajin, Deir-ez-Zor and Kisreh all had more than 5,000 IDPs living in vulnerable shelter types.
- **The highest number of IDPs living in collective centres was found in Thiban,** where an estimated 30% of IDPs in assessed communities were living in such shelters.
- **All of the IDPs in assessed communities and sites in Susat sub-district were staying in three informal tented sites** with no access to improved shelter.

The situation in Deir-ez-Zor governorate remains highly volatile and significant displacements have continued to take place in recent weeks. IDPs arriving to communities that have already seen significant displacement may not be able to find shelter even for

relatively short periods of time. As such, there is likely to be a need for short-term shelter support for IDPs in transit and temporarily displaced IDPs, especially those in highly vulnerable situations such as children traveling alone.

Methodology

In this third round of the Deir-ez-Zor Situation Overview, 112 locations across the governorate were assessed between 4 and 11 June 2018 through remote Key Informant (KI) interviews. While efforts were made to cover as many locations as possible, assessed sites and communities were selected on the basis of accessibility and coverage should not be considered comprehensive. Furthermore, findings are not statistically representative and should be considered as indicative only.
