

Bor - IDP Intentions Assessment

Bor South County, Jonglei State, South Sudan

Methodology

These findings are based on primary data collected by REACH, between 30th October and 5th November 2015.

REACH staff interviewed IDPs in Bor to understand where they have come from, where they would go if they were able to leave, and what push and pull factors inform their decisions.

A random sample of 284 households were interviewed, providing a representative sample of the roughly 1,080 dwelling units with a confidence of 95% and a margin of error of 5% at site level.




