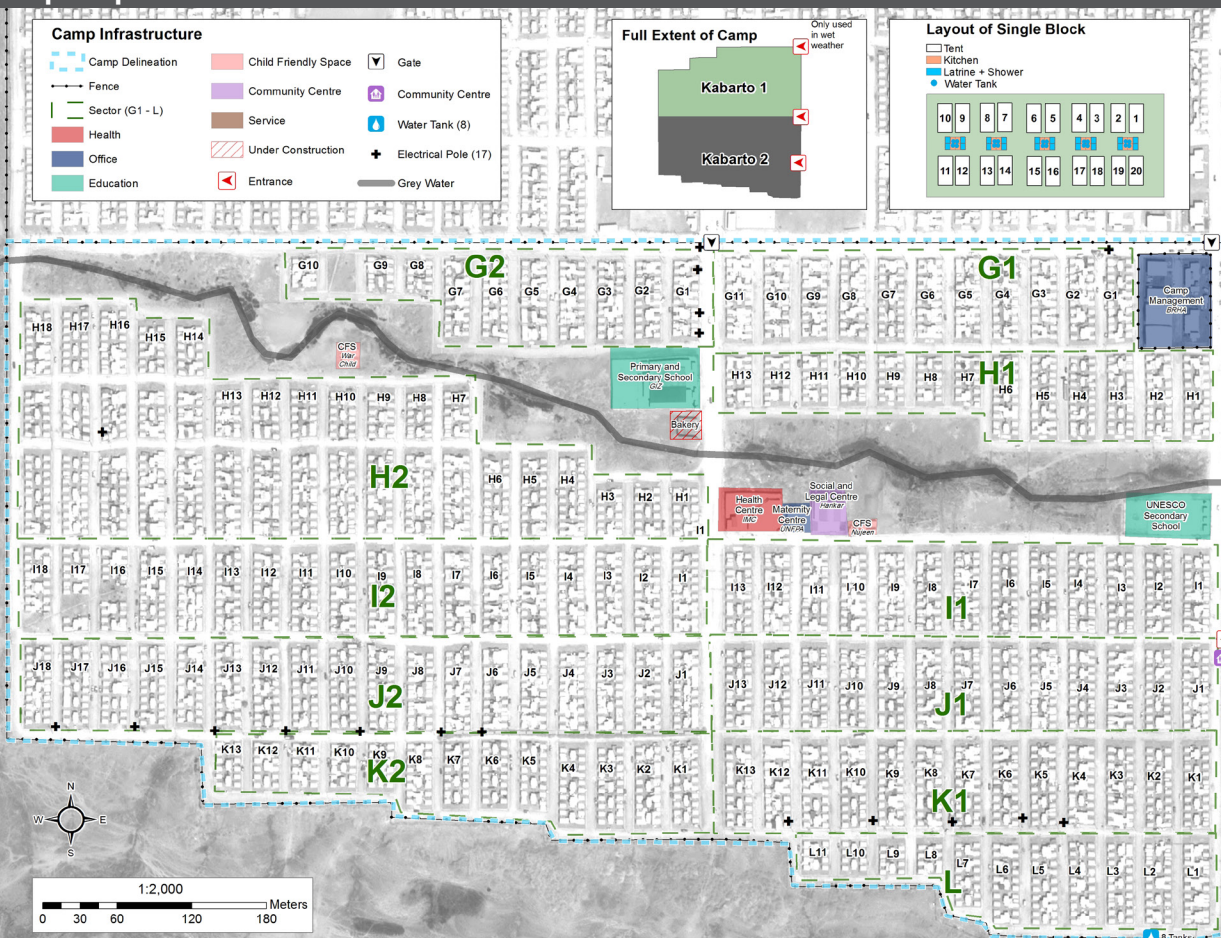


Location Map
