

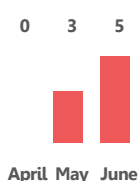
Emergency Rapid Response Mechanism (ERRM) Consortium in South Sudan

April- June 2022

The Emergency Rapid Response Mechanism (ERRM) is a modality to respond to sudden onset shocks and emergencies through the provision of rapid multi-sectoral humanitarian assistance in order to save lives and support affected individuals, households, and communities to address their immediate needs in South Sudan. The Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), Danish Refugee Council (DRC) and Medair make up the ERRM Consortium with NRC being the lead agency. The Consortium is currently funded by the European Union through Directorate-General for European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (DG ECHO).

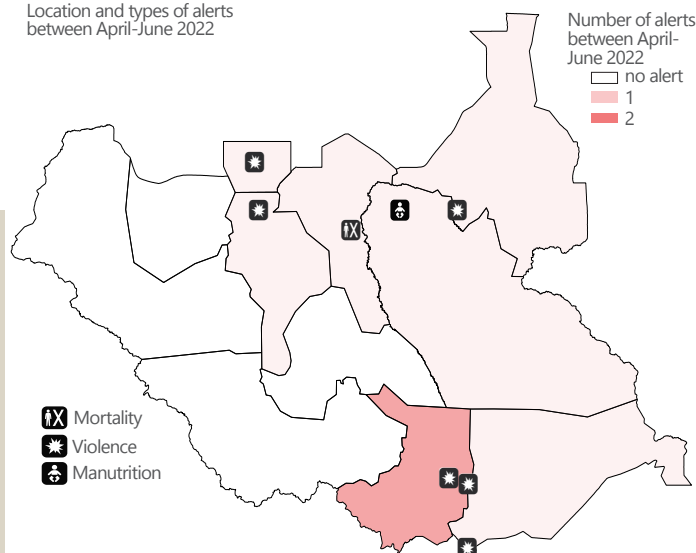
Number of alerts received between April-June 2022:

ERRM Triggers:

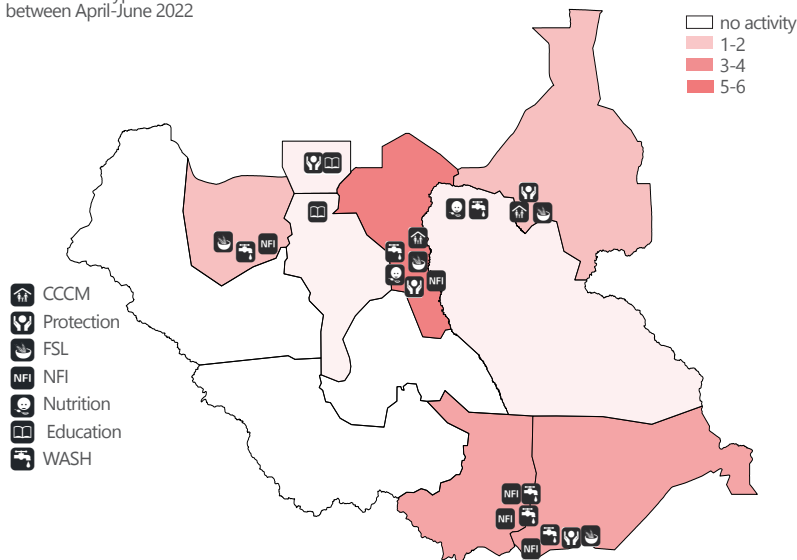
- Sudden high levels of movement (IDPs/returnees/refugees) including new displacement to project location (>10% increase in population in target locations OR > 3,000 IDPs).
- Newly accessible area identified for response by the Inter Cluster Co-ordination Group (ICCG)/response scale-up requested by the ICCG.
- High mortality rates reported (crude mortality rate >1 death/10,000 persons/day; under 5 mortality rate >2 deaths/10,000 persons/day).
- Emergency levels of malnutrition (Global Acute Malnutrition (GAM) > 15% or GAM between 10-14.9% with aggravating factors; Proxy GAM ≥ 10%).
- Confirmed disease outbreaks.
- Impact of flooding, with indicators for response including reports of >50% crops or livestock loss.
- Rapid increase of food insecurity and malnutrition, with indicators including spike in population distribution facing Integrated Phase Classification (IPC) Phase 4 or 5 levels of acute food insecurity.
- Reports of widespread human rights violations and grave violations against children.

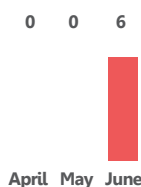
