

# Yusuf Batil Refugee Camp - Key Sector Findings

Maban County, Upper Nile State, South Sudan

This factsheet provides an overview of key findings from a comprehensive assessment of the camp.

Findings are based on data collected from 7,189 households, between 2 March and 7 July 2015, and can be generalised to the entire camp population with 99% confidence and 0.9% margin of error.



## Demographics

Total camp population: **40,648** (UNHCR)

Children aged under 18: **58%**

Average household size: **4.5**

Age dependency ratio: **123**

## Protection

Involvement in a security incident since arrival in the camp:

14% **yes**  
86% **no**



These households most commonly reported tent damage (66%); and robbery (52%).

Reported first point of contact in the case of an incident:

98% **sheik**  
0% **camp committee**  
2% **umda**  
0% **others**



Reported effectiveness of law enforcement in the camp (sheikhs, community watch & police):

Good **39%**  
Ok, could improve **58%**  
Poor **2%**

## Priority Concerns

Reported priority needs:

- 1 Security
- 2 Food
- 3 Education

## Livelihoods

Households cultivating land:

60% **yes**  
40% **no**



Households herding livestock:

18% **yes**  
82% **no**



## Access to land

Households reported farming refugee camp land (92%); host community land (10%); and communal land (3%).

Focus group discussions highlighted that **land is a key source of tensions with the host community.**

Most commonly planted crops by households cultivating land:

Maize **79%**  
Okra **77%**  
Sorghum **54%**

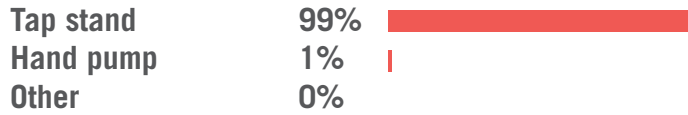

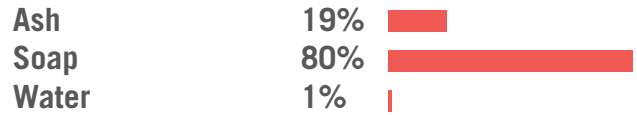
## Water, Hygiene & Sanitation

Reported waiting times to collect water:

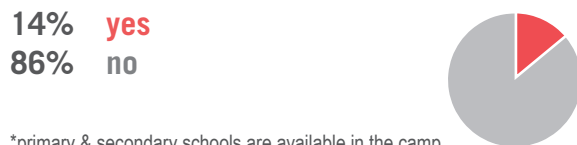


Households reporting open defecation:

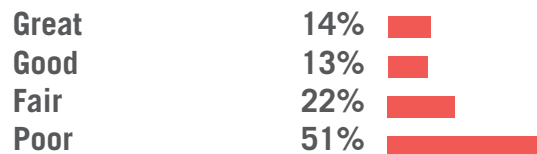
Households reporting out of school children:\*
