Juba County, Central Equatoria State, South Sudan

Methodology

These findings are based on primary data collected by REACH, between 27th August and 7th September 2015.

REACH staff interviewed IDPs in PoC 1 Juba to understand where they have come from, where they would go if they were able to leave, and what push and pull factors inform their decisions.

A random sample of 506 households were interviewed, providing a representative sample of the roughly 2,700 dwelling units (7,500 inhabitants) with a confidence of 95% and a margin of error of 5% at site level.


