# **Arbat IDP Formal Camp Profile**

Sulaymaniyah Governorate, Iraq

#### Summary

Arbat IDP camp was established in August 2013 as a transit site for Syrian refugees. Since August 2014 it now hosts internally displaced persons (IDPs). The main areas of origin of the residents are Balad and Sinjar districts in Salah Al Din and Ninewa

Governorates respectively.

Primary data was collected through household surveys from 16 - 18/11/2014. Additional information from camp managers, marked (\*) is correct as of 14/12/2014.


