





**Moldova: Refugee Accommodation Centres (RACs) Monthly Needs Monitoring & 2023 Overview** 

Update as of December 31, 2023

## **Background & Methodology**

Since the escalation of hostilities in neighbouring Ukraine on February 24, 2022, more than 1 million arrivals from Ukraine have been registered in Moldova. As of December 31, 2023, 129,753 refugees remain in the country (UNHCR). To respond to their needs, the Moldovan authorities established a total of 136 Refugee Accommodation Centres (RACs) across the country. At the beginning of 2023, 67 RACs were active, and by the end of the year, 44 Centres remained open.

To understand the needs of these Centres, REACH, in partnership with the National Agency for Social Assistance (ANAS) and with the support of UNHCR and ACTED, conducted key informant interviews (KIIs) with purposefully selected RAC focal points who reported on the situation in the Centres.

For the last data collection round of 2023, interviews were conducted with representatives from 38 Centres. Additionally, this factsheet provides an overview of findings for 2023.\*



### Top RAC needs as of December 31st




## Locations of RACs active in 2023





















### Most frequent places of origin of people arriving at the RACs as reported by KIs

## **Average stay duration in RACs**


