## 2. Rationale

## 2.1. Rationale

During 2018, Iraq will continue to see an increasing rate of returns of internally displaced populations to their areas of origin. However, humanitarian actors are not anticipating these returns to occur uniformly across all areas of the country, highlighting the need to further explore barriers to returning as well as requisite conditions for safe and voluntary returns. Through an area-based approach, humanitarian actors can operate at a more localized level to design a response that is geographically targeted, inclusive of a range of local, international, and governmental actors, and is inter-sectoral in its programme delivery.

To inform this highly collaborative, coordinated, and localized response, humanitarian, stabilization, development and government actors require a strong evidence base that is multi-sectoral, and can inform short, medium and long-term interventions in the area by the wide range of actors outlined above. In order to provide this base of evidence, the ABA framework will combine secondary data with primary data collection to fill informational gaps regarding current available information regarding the provision of services, core needs, and operational actors within the area; community perceptions of service provider overviews of the dynamics affecting the current provision of services; and a detailed, representative assessment of needs and vulnerabilities at the household level.

# 3. Methodology

## 2.1. Methodology overview

The ABA will employ a mixed methods approach that combines the analysis of secondary data with both quantitative and qualitative primary data collection methods in the form of:

- Key Informant Interviews (KIIs)
- Community group discussions (CGDs)
- Participatory mapping
- Household-level surveys

As of April 2018, an ABA is ongoing in the Mosul al Jadida municipality of west Mosul, with an additional JRAM planned for Telafar city with a tentative start date in July. As noted above, the geographic scope of the ABAs will follow the setup of CRCs by operational partners throughout Iraq.ADD

Each ABA will begin with a comprehensive secondary data review (SDR), with the aim of capturing information that already exists about the area targeted for assessment. The availability of existing information will, in turn, inform the primary data collection methods that will be utilized. As a consequence, not every data collection method listed above will be utilized within every separate ABA, in order to avoid duplication of effort.

To begin with, these assessments will be coordinated and implemented by REACH under the framework of the Community Resource Centre Steering Committee (CRC SC) which is chaired by the Returns Working Group (RWG) in Iraq. After consultation with the CRC SC, it was determined that the ABA will be carried out in all areas in which CRCs will be established, in order to provide a comprehensive baseline for the operations related to that CRC. However, it is important to note that not all ABAs will be conducted by REACH – rather, REACH will provide training to CRC partners using a toolkit to be developed by REACH in collaboration with the CRC SC. Core assessment indicators, data collection methodology, and analysis of the collected data will be aligned with the Multi-Sector Response Framework (MSRF), a guidance document

developed by the RWG with input from relevant clusters to facilitate coordinated area-based interventions in support of Iraq's conflict-affected populations.

The following sectors will be addressed by the various components of the ABA; solid waste management, provision of water, provision of electricity, education, healthcare, livelihoods, food security, assistance, shelter and protection. Some of these categories will be addressed by both the qualitative and quantitative components of the assessment, while some will only be covered by the quantitative assessment.

Following the completion of primary data collection, REACH will conduct preliminary analysis and present findings at a joint analysis workshop, bringing together relevant humanitarian and stabilisation actors to facilitate a nuanced and contextualized analysis of the data. Based on the discussions and feedback received through the joint analysis exercise, REACH will produce multiple research outputs, including a final cleaned dataset, thematic maps, area profiles, and a final report.

## 2.2. Population of interest

All population groups<sup>9</sup> residing in the urban area assessed, including:

- Internally displaced persons (IDPs) residing in and out of camps including those in informal sites
- Non-displaced
- Returnees

## 2.3. Secondary data review

A secondary data review (SDR) will be conducted by REACH in order to support the implementation of primary data collection. This SDR will include a thorough examination of the following:

- Population data (e.g. IOM Displacement Tracking Matrix)
- Data and reports from previous needs and vulnerability assessments (e.g. WFP MVAM, UNHCR Protection Monitoring, etc.)
- General background and context research on areas being targeted for assessment
- Geo-spatial data (e.g. UNOSAT satellite imagery)
- Tools and Lessons Learned from previous ABAs

## 2.4. Primary data collection

#### 2.4.1. Sampling

#### Selection of areas to be assessed

The urban area of assessment (entire city, municipality, neighbourhood) will be chosen in collaboration with the CRC Steering Committee. As the definition of "urban area" is heavily dependent on the context in which a planned CRC is located, it can range from a municipality within a city to a smaller city and adjacent settlements. Therefore, the scope of the area will be determined on a case-by-case basis, which will be outlined in the annexed methodology notes. As assessment areas will be selected by CRC partners, and as there are no reliable population figures for settled areas of Iraq, no minimum size can be identified.

#### Sampling: Semi-Structured Key Informant Interviews (KII) and Community Group Discussions (CGD)

Purposive sampling methods will be employed for the KII and CGD components of the assessment. REACH enumerators will utilize existing KI networks to identify *mukhtars*<sup>10</sup> and other community leaders with comprehensive knowledge of their area of responsibility, and will then use a snowballing approach to identify additional participants until all (if possible) identified locations (whether neighbourhood or village) within the assessment area are represented by a community leader

KI. These KIs will provide information concerning demographics, as well as the availability and functionality of services and public infrastructure within their area of knowledge/responsibility.

Regarding CGDs, REACH teams will again source participants with support from identified community leader KIs, ensuring that CGDs are held in a variety of distinct locations (whether neighbourhood, town or village) within the area of assessment, utilizing data previously gathered from community leader KIs in order to ensure that CGD locations represent a population types, needs, and levels of access to services. CGD participants will be selected in consultation with community leaders, and will equally represent both male and female respondents whenever possible within the cultural context. In selecting participants for the CGDs, community leaders facilitating the process will be requested to select individuals with specific sectoral knowledge, particularly doctors, teachers, engineers, and municipal employees. The number of total CGDs conducted will largely depend on the size of the assessment area and the capacity of the REACH team.

For the purposes of collecting expert feedback on the provision of services in the area of assessment, KIIs will also be conducted with five subject matter experts each in the fields of healthcare, education, water, electricity, and solid waste disposal.<sup>11</sup>

#### Sampling: Structured Household-level Needs Assessment

Accurate population data for most areas of Iraq is limited, both in terms of overall population, figures by population group (IDP, non-displaced, returnee etc.) and at the neighbourhood/municipal/village level. Therefore, to facilitate the development of a sampling framework, REACH will use information regarding population numbers, population groups present, and distribution of population groups provided by KIIs conducted in the qualitative portion of the assessment to fill these information gaps. This qualitative data can also be used to triangulate secondary data from other sources. However, even these methods are unlikely to produce population data that is accurate enough for the drawing of a representative sample frame.

Once this exercise is completed, sampling for the household-level assessment will follow one of three scenarios:

- 1. Population data, population group data, and density data available: A sample frame will be drawn for the area of assessment based on identified population figures, stratified for all population groups present (stratified area-wide sample). GPS points will be randomly distributed throughout the residential sections of the area of assessment, weighting for population density. Expected to be statistically representative at the population group level with a 95% level of confidence and a 10% margin of error, and representative at the area level with a 95% level of confidence and a 5% margin of error.
- 2. Population data available and density data available, population group data unavailable: A sample frame with be drawn for the area of assessment based on identified population figures (unstratified area-wide sample). GPS points will be randomly distributed throughout the residential section of the area of assessment, weighting for population density. Expected to be statistically representative at the area level with a 95% level of confidence and a 5% margin of error.
- 3. Population data and population group data available, and population density unavailable: A sample frame will be drawn for the area of assessment based on identified population figures, stratified for all population groups present (stratified area-wide sample). GPS points will be randomly distributed throughout the residential sections of the area of assessment. Expected to be statistically representative at the area level with a 95% level of confidence and a 5% margin of error.
- 4. **Population data, population group data, and population density data unavailable**: A sample frame will be drawn for the area of assessment assuming an infinite population (unstratified area-wide sample). GPS points will be randomly distributed throughout the residential sections of the area of assessment. Expected to be statistically representative at the area level with a 95% level of confidence and a 5% margin of error.

## 2.4.2. Field Data Collection

## Qualitative Data Collection

## Key Informant Interviews (KIIs)

a. Key informant interviews (KIIs) with mukhtars and other community leaders, exogenous humanitarian and stabilization actors and municipal and local service providers.

- b. Interviews will be conducted in person and by phone, depending on logistics, resources, and security/access restrictions.
- c. All KIIs will be conducted using a paper-based questionnaire translated into Arabic, with debriefing of enumerators conducted by REACH assessment staff.
- d. When possible and relevant, participatory mapping exercises will be conducted with service provider KIs in order to identify the location and functionality of key infrastructure.

#### **Community Group Discussions (CGDs)**

- a. Community group discussions will serve to contextualize secondary data and information provided by KIs, as well as to obtain nuanced information regarding perceptions and expectations related to service delivery.
- b. Participatory mapping exercise to identify the availability and functionality of services within their area.
- c. All CGDs will be conducted using a paper-based questionnaire translated into Arabic, with debriefing of facilitators conducted by REACH assessment staff.
- d. All CGDs will be stratified by gender, with female enumerator staff conducting all CGDs with female participants.

#### **Quantitative Data Collection**

#### **Household Needs Survey**

- a. Data collection will be implemented both by REACH enumerators and by partner enumerators where possible, who will collect household-level data through a comprehensive multi-sectorial tool built from the indicators in the MSRF. Overall coordination of joint data collection and data cleaning will be led by REACH.
- b. Enumerators will record interview responses digitally using KoBo Collect, an android-based mobile data collection application. All indicators will either be drawn directly from or aligned with the MSRF.<sup>12</sup>

#### Partner-driven data collection on all assessments

For the purposes of quantitative household-level data collection, REACH will be enlisting the support of partner agencies when relevant. Partners will be identified based on their operational presence in areas selected for assessment, and their capacity to conduct the assessment within the data collection period. All partner enumerators will be fully trained by REACH, and all coordination of the partner data collection and data cleaning process will be carried out by REACH assessment staff.

#### 2.5. Data Processing & Analysis

Qualitative data generated through key informant interviews and CGDs will be synthesized and organized in line with the qualitative data analysis framework. Data will be triangulated with secondary sources, as well as with the information gathered in the quantitative assessment, and follow-up data collection will be conducted if deemed necessary to address inconsistencies or information gaps.

All appropriate methods of quantitative data analysis will be used to provide analytical depth to the findings. Quantitative data will be analysed by a review of descriptive statistics in addition to more advanced statistical analysis where appropriate, through the use of SPSS or other software packages. Findings will be presented at the population group level (when possible) to enable a comparative analysis of needs and perceptions, utilizing statistical significance testing to analyse population differences.
