





Overview of RRM activities in 2017


Activities distribution in June and in 2017





To meet the immediate needs of families within 15 days of violence and/or displacement, the RRM is seeking \$1 million to support 180,000 children and families, by:

- Providing emergency shelter to families who have had their homes destroyed
- Installing safe water points and latrines in displacement sites
- Distributing essential items like soap, jerry cans, sleeping mats, buckets and blankets


