


BANGLADESH - Rohingya Refugee Crisis - Cox's Bazar District

The map shows cyclone shelters and cyclone shelter catchment areas (1km buffer around the cyclone shelters). The shelter data was obtained from the following sources: i) the list of cyclone shelters outlined in the 2015 District Disaster Management Plan, ii) the list of cyclone shelters obtained from the Ukhiya UNO office, iii) the list of cyclone shelters managed by the Cyclone Preparedness Program, and iv) lists of buildings scheduled for rehabilitation or upgrading to cyclone shelters by IOM, UNHCR, and WFP.

GPS coordinates for the majority of shelters have been taken from a mapping exercise conducted by UNDP on April 2018. For shelters where UNDP coordinates were not available, IOM, UNHCR, and WFP coordinates have been used. Where none of the above were available, REACH teams conducted field visits together with UNO staff to collect GPS coordinates.

The catchment area (1km buffer) around the cyclone shelters indicates that, one particular cyclone shelter will be able to provide shelter to people for up to 1km around it.
