2. Rationale

2.1. Rationale

Since September 2019, the value of the Syrian pound has been plummeting due to a combination of; heightening regional tensions limiting cash flow, the effects of over nine years of violent conflict and, economic sanctions.¹ In December 2019, REACH reported a rapid increase in the cost of fuel and of the value of the Survival Minimum Expenditure basket (SMEB).^{2,3} Considering the deteriorating economic conditions in Syria, humanitarian partners have expressed a need to have data on the main employment sectors for unskilled labour in northwest Syria and the average daily wage for unskilled labour in assessed communities to understand the impact of deteriorating economic conditions on employment opportunities.

3. Methodology

3.1. Methodology overview

Primary data collection will be conducted by REACH enumerators, remotely contacting Key Informants (KIs) in 158 assessed communities in northwest Syria. Data will be collected using structured KI interviews. KIs will be selected based on their knowledge of economic conditions in Syria.

For data collection, one community KI will provide information to enumerators regarding the main employment sectors employing unskilled labour in the assessed community and the average daily wage for unskilled labour in the assessed community.

3.2 Population of interest

³ The SMEB represents the minimum, culturally adjusted items required to support a 6-person household for a month. The commodities are typically sold in markets and consumed by average Syrian households. Items include fresh food and bulk food, non-food items (NFIs), water, fuel, and cell phone data.

The population of interest is all individuals working in unskilled labour in northwest Syria including Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), Spontaneous Returnees (SRs) and residents.

3.3 Primary Data Collection

Data collection will occur over two days. Data will be collected by REACH enumerators who will remotely contact KIs. Enumerators will collect data from the assessed communities specified above.

Assessed communities were chosen to ensure an even geographical spread across northwest Syria and depending on the availability of knowledgeable KIs to answer the specified questions.

3.5. Data Processing & Analysis

Data cleaning will take place after data collection and will include follow-up to address errors and outliers. Data cleaning logs and the raw data will be kept. A data deletion report will be maintained to track any information excluded from the raw data following data cleaning. The collected data will be analysed using Excel to answer the research questions. Analysis will consist of ascertaining the top three employment sectors employing unskilled labour and a calculation of the median daily wage.

This analysis will be presented in a dataset as well as a factsheet that may also contain geographic representations of the data made using ArcGIS Pro. Lastly, the collected data will be anonymised to create a dataset that can be easily used by other partners.
