




The corresponding LGAs have been selected using INSO data, and less than 5% of IDPs and / or 20% of returnees out of the total accessible LGA population (IOM Displacement Tracking Matrix round 26)

Findings were drawn from an analytical framework proposed by REACH at the global level for the implementation of all Multi-Sector Needs Assessments, and incorporates elements from the global draft Joint Inter-sectoral Analysis Framework (JIAF). The end result of this analytical framework, the Multi-Sector Needs Index (MSNI) draws on several components such as the impact of the crisis on households; the living standard gaps (LSG, sectoral analysis); and the capacity gaps (negative coping strategies). The MSNI categorizes households in minimal (1), stress (2), severe (3) or extreme (4) severity of needs.
