



As the majority of the population in the assessed locations are farmers, the loss of crops, seeds and livestock, due to Hurricane Matthew, led to negative coping strategies. One of these strategies is the production of charcoal. The charcoal is sold in local markets and the revenue is used to buy food, which is now mainly produced in other parts of the country.
