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2. Rationale

2.1. Rationale

Protracted conflicts, natural disasters, and the lack of livelihood opportunities⁶ are the main drivers of the Somali displacement crisis for the last two decades. According to the second round of the Detailed Site Assessment (DSA) conducted by REACH between October 2018 and January 2019, there are an estimated 2.3 million IDPs living in 1718 IDP sites across 58 districts⁷. The information collected with the DSA was done through two key informants per site. The CSA, being a representative household surveys, allows a more in-depth assessment of the selected districts and to triangulate the information collected from the DSA.

The Comprehensive Site Assessment (CSA) is designed to complement the DSA information. The CSA is comprised of a household level survey based on a representative sample of IDP sites in each targeted district. The first round of the CSA which was conducted in March 2018 targeted Baidoa and Afgooye districts. For the second round of the CSA, the CCCM cluster chose Mogadishu Khada, Mogadishu Daynile (two districts with the most IDPs in Mogadishu), Hargeisa and Bossaso to be targeted, based on growing interest from partners and a lack of information in these locations. In addition to the household surveys, REACH will also conduct a facility assessment of all schools, health, and nutrition and cholera centers accessible by IDP site residents to map any gap in service provision. Altogether, the household survey and the facility mapping will bring a comprehensive overview of the current situation for the IDP sites residents across different sectors. Detailed information at district-level will enable operational partners to plan an appropriate response to the needs in those areas based on existing gaps identified across sectors.

3. Methodology

2.1. Methodology overview

This assessment is mainly focused on primary data collection through household surveys. The survey questionnaire is based on questionnaires used in previous assessments conducted by REACH in Somalia, especially the Joint Multi Cluster Needs Assessment in 2018. In addition, a consultative process to tailor the survey to information needs was conducted through the CCCM cluster. Inputs during this process were received from the Health, Nutrition, Protection, Shelter and Non Food Items, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, and Education clusters.

In addition to the household surveys, the CSA will also comprise of a mapping exercise of key service facilities in assessed areas. For the facility mapping, education and health clusters will provide the list of facilities⁸ available. The enumerators will start with the facilities from the lists, and once information on each facility has been collected, the enumerator will ask the person in charge if there is any other facility available to ensure all facilities have been covered.

2.2. Population of interest

- Geographical area: The four districts (Daynile, Khada, Hargeisa, Bossaso) were selected according to the information needs of CCCM cluster. The CSA is covering only the main urban center. In Hargeisa and Bossaso districts, only the sites inside and in the surrounding of Hargeisa and Bossaso urban center will be sampled from. In Khada and Daynile, both districts will be completely targeted as they are administrative boundaries of Mogadishu city.
- For the household level assessment

- Population assessed: The population living in IDP sites (formal and informal) in assessed districts
- Unit of measurement: household
- For the facility mapping:
 - Population assessed: The population living in IDP sites (formal and informal) in assessed districts, through the facilities accessed by IDP site residents
 - Unit of measurement: facility

2.3. Secondary data review (outline key bibliography/sources you will use and for what).

- Secondary data sources to be reviewed include:
 - REACH DSA⁹ (2018)
 - REACH Joint Multi Cluster Need Assessment¹⁰ (2018)
 - Facility lists from the clusters

2.4. Primary Data Collection

- Household surveys
 - Method: Enumerators hired by REACH will conduct household surveys in IDP sites. The persons interviewed will have to be adults (18 years old or above). If present the head of the household will be interviewed, if not present anyone who can represent the head of the household.
 - Sampling: Stratified cluster sampling to generate results that would be representative to the IDP site population within each targeted district with 95% level of confidence interval and 10% of margin of error¹¹. A 10% buffer has been added for surveys that will not be conducted at the correct location, in the correct time frame or if the sites cannot be found. Household will be randomly selected by enumerators, selecting a random selection (spinning a bottle or a pen) and then interview each Xth households, where X is the total number of households / number of surveys to be conducted in that place. See annex for the sampling frame.
 - Tools: The questionnaire is a multi-sectoral structured questionnaire. It aims to collection information at household levels about their situation on the different sectors (demographic, displacement, protection, livelihood, food security, nutrition, health, WASH, shelter and NFI, education, and accountability to affected population). The questionnaire has been circulated to the different cluster for their inputs. The questionnaire will be uploaded to REACH Kobo server.
- Facility mapping:
 - Method: Education and health cluster will provide the list of facilities in the districts. Enumerators hired by REACH will conduct a key informant interview if someone in charge of the facility is present, if not the enumerator will fill out an observation survey at the facility adapted to each facility type.
 - Sampling: Snowballing sampling. The enumerators will start with the facilities from the lists, and once information on each facility has been collected, the enumerator will ask the person in charge if there is any other facility available to ensure all facilities have been covered.
 - Tool: The tool for the facility mapping is a structured questionnaire to collect the names, services available and location of the different facilities. If nobody is present to answer the question, the questionnaire can be filled as observations. Tool will be uploaded to the REACH Kobo server.

2.5. Data Processing & Analysis

- Enumerators will use ODK to collect the surveys and will update them every evening to the REACH Kobo server. A webmap will be available for the field officer to follow up the daily data collection to ensure that the surveys are collected at the correct locations. In case that enumerator(s) are not collecting data correctly (e.g. too closed to each other, wrong location, etc.), those surveys will be removed and will have to be recollected. In case the sites are not accessible during the data collection or they have moved, a resampling will take place for these locations. A data checking log will be kept to allow tracing of survey changes.
- At the end of the data collection, the assessment officer with the help of the GIS officer will validate if the data collection followed the sampling frame.
- Field officers will be responsible for downloading the dataset and do data checks and fill the cleaning log using an excel macro enabled workbook. The macros highlighting the value to be checked will be set by the assessment officer. The assessment officer will then verify the data cleaning and be responsible to validate the data cleaning.
- In addition, checks on the data will be done by the field officers and assessment officer on a daily basis during the data collection to ensure best data collection quality.
- Anonymized version of the raw data, clean data, cleaning log and deleted logs will be sent to the HQ data unit for final review and validation.
- The analysis will be performed using the MSNA R script developed by the HQ data unit. Extra analysis not done with that script will also be done through R (e.g. demographics of the households, proportion of children going to school, etc). All analysis will be sent to the data unit for validation.
