## 2. Rationale

### 2.1. Rationale

As of October 2020, Ukraine has recorded more than 300,000 cases of COVID-19, in the fall 2020 experiencing an exponential rise in the number of confirmed cases. According to the OECD, Ukraine's GDP fell 6.2% year-on-year in January and July 2020, while World Bank estimates show that the economy will contract by -7.2% in 2020.<sup>3</sup> In an economy where the share of the workers in the informal economy is as high as 30% this could give rise to a new group of new vulnerable populations.<sup>4</sup> Measures relating to limiting the spread of COVID-19 such as movement restrictions, closing or limiting access to markets and disruptions of the global chain supply could put a strain on the economy and increase the poverty among the most vulnerable groups.

Eastern Ukraine finds itself in an even more difficult position. An ageing population affected by the conflict, often with only one source of income, is more vulnerable in case of sickness or COVID-19 related restrictions. People living close to the contact line contend with damaged and aged utility infrastructure, most often lacking money to buy enough winter clothing and fuel to go through the winter. Assessments done by REACH identified that the contact line largely disconnected Government-Controlled-Areas (GCA) peripheries from their urban centres in Non-Government Controlled Areas (NGCA) such as Donetsk, Luhansk and, Horlivka.<sup>5</sup> Despite that some re-economic organisation has occurred in recent years, the compound effect of COVID-19 and conflict crisis may increase vulnerability to an already fragile population. Further investigation of economic resilience of these households, their capacity to cope, recover and, reconstruct in face of shocks is becoming a major component in the process of reconstruction.<sup>6</sup>

In order to investigate the compounded impact of COVID-19 and conflict, REACH Initiative is conducting an assessment to review the current economic resilience status of households close to the contact line, succeeded by a second round of data collection after winter, to probe how resilience of households evolved over winter. The assessment will largely focus on the food security and access to livelihoods status of households as proxies of economic resilience. The assessment is inspired by the Household Economy Approach, a methodological model which provides insights on how shocks influence the household economy.<sup>7</sup> The model was tailored to a lower middle-income industrialized context using knowledge developed through previous REACH assessments.

## 3. Methodology

### 3.1. Methodology overview

This study will be built upon the Household Economy Approach (HEA), a livelihood-based framework for analysing how people access food and cash in order to cover basic needs. This method is built around the concept of livelihood zones, geographical areas where people share similar patterns of access to food and income. The livelihood zones will be reflected in the stratification illustrated by six areas: large urban centers, urban centers and rural areas in Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts, respectively. This delimitation took into account specific socio-economic attributes of each zones informed by previous REACH assessments.

The main components of HERA are:

1. A secondary data analysis of the 2020 GCA MCNA dataset. This exercise will help developing a typology of household demographic and economic vulnerability focusing on the Food Consumption Score (FCS) and the Livelihood Coping Strategy Index (LCS).
2. A secondary data analysis of REACH products such as the 2020 GCA MSNA, the 2019 Economic Security Assessment along with other publications from REACH partners.<sup>8</sup> Based on the results of the SDR, a selection of socio-economic indicators will be considered as a baseline “normal” household economic situation.
3. A quantitative survey covering households bordering the contact line in Government Controlled Areas in eastern Ukraine. The survey will include a core set of household economic questions intended to analyse the current economic security of households in terms of income, general and food expenses, livelihood coping mechanisms, as well as perceptions about the winter outlook. In order to capture most accurately the pre-winter situation, data collection is scheduled to begin in November 2020. The results will be compared to the baseline “normal” economic situation resulted from the secondary data analysis from the previous step. Comparing these results with the baseline indicators would allow for an analysis of the impact of the ongoing compounded COVID-19 and conflict crises in eastern Ukraine. The survey will include six stratas (large urban areas, urban areas and rural areas in Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts), covering in total 2,400 households.
4. A shorter quantitative survey which will measure the macro-level change of household economy throughout the winter. The survey will include three stratas (large urban, urban, and rural), covering approximately 1,200 households. The decision to focus on a more limited geographical scope (large urban, urban, and rural) is due to the interest in the uniform macroeconomic changes expected during the winter in Donetsk and Luhansk regions combined.

### 3.2. Population of interest

The population of interest in this assessment is defined as:

***Displaced and non-displaced persons who are resident in settlements located in raions bordering the contact line.***

Within the area along contact line, populations will be compared by the kind of settlement they live in, namely large urban, urban, or rural settlement. The area along the contact line has been selected for this assessment due to the severity of the conflict's impact on this region and the findings of previous reviews of humanitarian data in Ukraine regarding the most impacted populations by the ongoing crisis.

### 3.4. Primary Data Collection

Primary data will be collected through two rounds of data collection, first one through a survey applied to approximately 2,400 households in the pre-winter period (November 2020) and a second survey post-winter period consisting of 1200 household surveys. The choice to conduct a second survey with a smaller number of geographical stratas (large urban, urban and rural) was due to the interest in the post-winter macro-level changes in households' economic vulnerability.

For each round of data collection, households will be selected based on a 2-stages random stratified sampling, first by settlement and then by population for each settlement to create a representative sample of the general population within the following strata (95% confidence level, 5% margin of error for each stratum):

More specifically, population data will be taken from the official population data provided by the State Statistics Service of Ukraine updated on a yearly basis using birth, death, and migration data. This data will be used to weight a computerized random point selection within each region using QGIS, meaning that within each stratum, areas with higher density are proportionally more likely to be selected for interview, thereby reducing the likelihood of a computer-selected point being in an uninhabited area. Households' contact details which were called for this assessment come from two sources:

- Households who were part of previous REACH-led assessments who agreed their contact details to be retained by REACH for follow-up calls regarding REACH assessments.<sup>9</sup>
- Contact details of households from local partners, such as NGOs or public administrations. Extra layers of protection of households' information such as: request of a minimal number of contact details of households (name, location, phone number), additional training provided to enumerators about data protection, enhanced security in data storage etc.

Contact details were checked for accuracy and duplicates. Incomplete phone numbers and phone number duplicates were removed. When called, the potential interviewee will be asked if they are the head of the household or if they are part of the decision-making process for household affairs and can answer on behalf of the household. If the respondent answers in the positive, and if they are aged 18 or older, then the interview can be conducted.

Based on current planning assumption the data collection will start on the second part of November 2020 and is expected to last for approximately 14 working days.

Data will be collected using the KOBO platform, and enumerators will be trained prior to data collection in the use of KOBO as well as interviewing techniques and issues of protection of vulnerable populations.

**3.4.1. Risks and mitigation**

Due to COVID-19 restrictions and in order to preserve the health of staff, data collection will be done remotely. The decision is based on the guidelines from IMPACT SoP for Data Collection during COVID-19.<sup>10</sup> Anonymised household details will be shared with enumerators. At the end of the interview, the household details are removed from the enumerators' devices, ensuring that the data is not stored into third party devices. At the end of each day, the database officer, in collaboration with the operations coordinator and the assessment officer, ensure that the data is safely uploaded to the KOBO server and the recorded interviews removed from enumerators' phones.

**2.5. Data Processing & Analysis**

Secondary data from the 2020 GCA MSNA will be analysed in order to identify knowledge gaps and needs for the HERA primary assessment. This analysis will focus on economic and food security indicators. Primary data will be analysed by REACH staff using similar data analysis methodologies related to economic and food security.

Primary data will be entered into Excel instantaneously from Kobo. During primary data collection, the REACH Data Officer will review data daily to ensure collection methodology is being followed by enumerators and investigate any outliers or other problematic data, including ensuring random sampling is being carried out in accordance with the sampling plan.

The Data Officer will keep a log of any changes, including cleaning of data. All data cleaning will be done in line with IMPACT's [Data Cleaning Minimum Standards Checklist](#). Data analysis will be done in line with the HEA framework. This framework aims at answering the core research questions outlined previously in order to estimate the severity of economic and food security needs of assessed households, along with the evolution of these needs throughout the winter.
