




New or additional tents, tarpaulins and plastic sheeting, and cash (for rental assistance) as the most common priority shelter need read, rice, and cooking oil, as the




Bread, rice, and cooking oil as the most common priority food need

• NFI: 187 sites reported needing mattresses/sleeping mats , 124 sites reported the need for cooking fuel , followed by 72 batteries , and 62 water containers

• **Protection:** 28 sites reported special need for **vulnerable groups** (women living alone, orphans, elderly, disabled, etc.) 26 sites reported need for **family reunification support**



• Healthcare: 22 sites reported the need for medicine, 20 for treatment for chronic diseases, 15 for first aid or emergency care



Methodology

The objective of this assessment was to gather information on:

1. The number of new IDP arrivals in camps, informal settlements, collective centres, or transit reception centres reported at the site level since 18 of December.

2. Movement intentions of the new IDP arrivals in the two weeks following the assessment

3. Identify priority needed items by sector of the new IDP arrivals

The assessed area consisted of eight sub-districts in Idleb and Western Aleppo governorates. Data was collected between 25 and 27 December 2019 by REACH enumerators who surveyed one to two Key Informants (KI) per community on IDP camps and sites nearest to their community. In order to qualify as camp or site, a site had to have 5 or more IDP households living on its premises. In total, 150 communities were assessed on 1,253 camps and sites. IDP numbers are registered numbers when available and KI estimates when not. KIs were selected for their expertise and knowledge on the camps and sites surrounding their community. **IDP numbers solely represent IDPs who recently arrived since 18 December in planned camps, informal settlements, collective centres, and transit reception centres, and do not account for total IDP site population or host community IDP population.**

Definitions

Informal settlements.

Otherwise known as a self-settled camp or spontaneous site, hosting five or more IDP households. IDPs may settle in a camp that is independent of assistance from the government or humanitarian community. These sites, established by IDPs or non-experienced actors, may include tented or other types of housing units such as unfinished buildings/apartments. Structures are often erected on land to which the occupants have no legal claim, and IDPs intend to stay in this location for an extended period of time. At the moment, most of the so-called IDP camps in Syria fall under this category.

Planned camp

A planned camp is a place where IDPs find accommodation on purpose built sites, where service infrastructure is provided and distributions take place. The camp is established by an accountable humanitarian actor and to the extent possible, meet the minimum Sphere standards.

Collective centre

A pre-existing building or other structure used to host 5 or more IDP households, e.g. public buildings, schools, mosques, private collective building.

Transit/Reception centre

Otherwise known as a transit camp, they provide temporary accommodation for displaced persons pending transfer to a suitable, safe, longer term camp or at the end of an operation as a staging point of return. Reception/transit centres are usually either intermediate or short-term installations. These sites are often established during extremely large displacements.
