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## Context and Background

Blighted by recurrent natural disasters, including avalanches, floods and earthquakes, and protracted conflict spanning nearly four decades, Afghanistan has been susceptible to constant displacement.<sup>1</sup> With more than 257,000 Internal Displaced Persons (IDPs) between 1 January and 19 September 2017<sup>2</sup> and the influx of more than 240,000 returnees<sup>3</sup>, new displacements have remained high in 2017.

Many of these populations reside in Informal Settlements (ISETs) throughout Afghanistan. These ISETs are defined as any area in which more than 50% of the households (HH) are displaced and for which residents do not have written, legal documentation for land use.

Characteristically, these sites have limited access to essential services, such as healthcare and education, and overall financial vulnerability is prevalent.<sup>4</sup> As such, REACH, with the support of Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), aimed to find and profile all ISETs throughout Afghanistan's 34 provinces. Previous data collection rounds, beginning with the profiling of ISETs in the provinces of Kabul and Nangarhar, laid the foundation for this nationwide profiling project.

This profiling project identified 1,677 ISETs throughout the country. These ISETs host more than 2.2 million displaced individuals; almost all of which were forcibly displaced populations, including IDPs, returnees and refugees. This high proportion of displaced populations indicates significant vulnerability within ISETs.

## Rationale

By working directly with ISETs key informants, this project allows for the identification of the poorest and most vulnerable households within the sites and across regions. Overall, ISET profiling provides a broader framework through which specific sectors should be observed in greater depth. Such investigations could help future segmentation of humanitarian needs and help identify durable solutions.

An example of this includes the OCHA Multi-Cluster Needs Assessments (MCNAs)<sup>5</sup> in Informal Settlements (November 2017). In these assessments, ISETs within 19 provinces, chosen based on their high density of displaced populations, provided the lens through which food security, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), and Emergency Shelter and Non-Food Items (ESNFI) vulnerabilities of displaced populations were identified. Findings from this assessment contributed to the 2018 Humanitarian Needs Overview and 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan.

In addition, information gathered through this ISET profiling can be used as a basis on which further monitoring and movement observation of displaced populations can take place. As the nature of displacement in Afghanistan is changing, coupled with the potential imminent forced return of 2.5 million refugees from Pakistan, there is a need for understandings of their specific needs and vulnerabilities.

# Objectives and Methodology

## Research Objectives

The objectives of the REACH ISET profiling project included:

- The identification of the demographic composition of ISETs.
- Developing a specific understanding of the ISETs population and history.
- Identify movement trends of displaced populations.
- Provide a lens through which sector-specific assessments can be conducted, informing targeted humanitarian interventions.

To meet these objectives, a thorough secondary data review was conducted, with lists of recognised ISETs at the district level provided by the Department of Refugees and Repatriation (DRR) in all provinces. Enumerators verified the authenticity of each ISET through field visits, while also identifying informed members of these communities. Informed members were identified by identifying the recognised ISET leader in each ISET capable of speaking on behalf of the community, often based in their role within the local Shura such as site leaders, members of Shura or elders.

## New Site Identification Tool

Firstly, by utilising the KIs identified in the initial list of ISETs provided by the DRR, a snowball sampling methodology was used to identify more ISETs in the surrounding area. This snowballing method consisted in asking KIs to identify other KIs from external ISETs and gathering their knowledge of these other ISETs. By building upon these contacts, further ISETs were identified until national coverage was reached.

## Primary Data Collection Tool

Secondly, the KIs identified in each site then took part in structured KI Interview (KII), consisting of questions on population demographics and displacements of HHs. In addition, the KIIs included questions on sectoral indicators, providing the ESNFI, WASH and Afghanistan Protection Clusters with information on key, related insecurities at the ISET level, facilitating knowledge of the area and potential beneficiary support.

## Primary Data Collection Summary

Accordingly, all data was collected between 3 October and 23 November 2017, with the initial 19 provinces included in the OCHA MCNA (see reports below) profiled in October, followed by the additional 15 provinces in November, resulting in coverage of all 34 provinces of Afghanistan.

## Limitations

- This profiling project intended to capture every ISET in Afghanistan. However, new sites have been reported to REACH after data collection was over due to time limitation. There is scope for further data collection in the future, particularly with the increasing and ongoing displacement in the country. Furthermore, the snowballing technique used to find ISETs results in limited geographical spread and a bias away from hard to reach areas. Therefore, findings presented in this booklet refer to the extensive sample of identified ISETs, with the intention being to broaden geographical reach in future data collection rounds.
- Findings rely on the knowledge of KIs, with these informants responding on behalf of their ISET community. Consequently, findings reflect the informed perspectives of these KIs and should be considered indicative only of the population.
- One of the objectives of this profiling project is to identify locations of displaced populations, thus needs of host communities in ISETs have not been captured. It is intended to include host communities in future rounds of data collection.

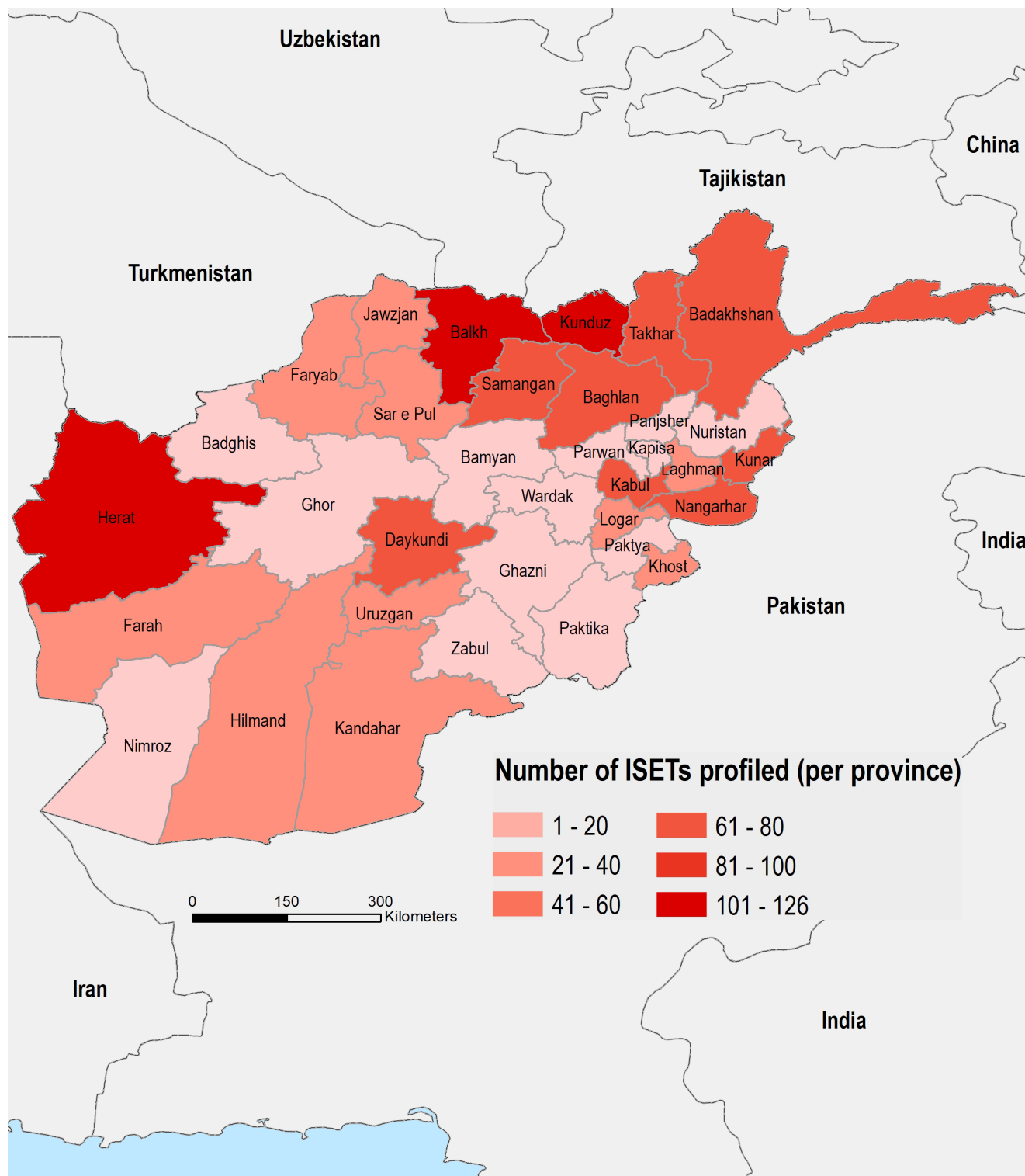

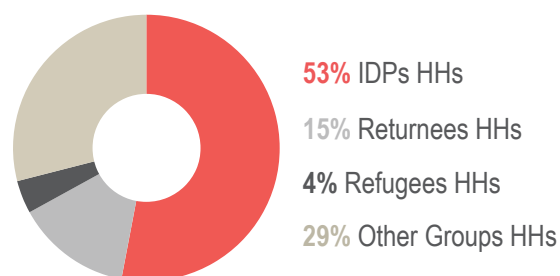

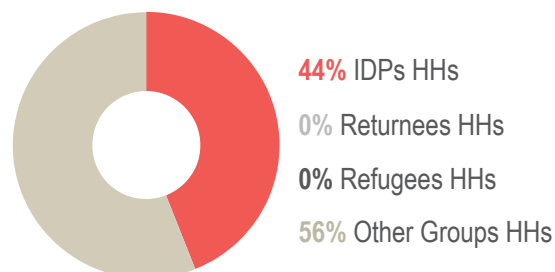

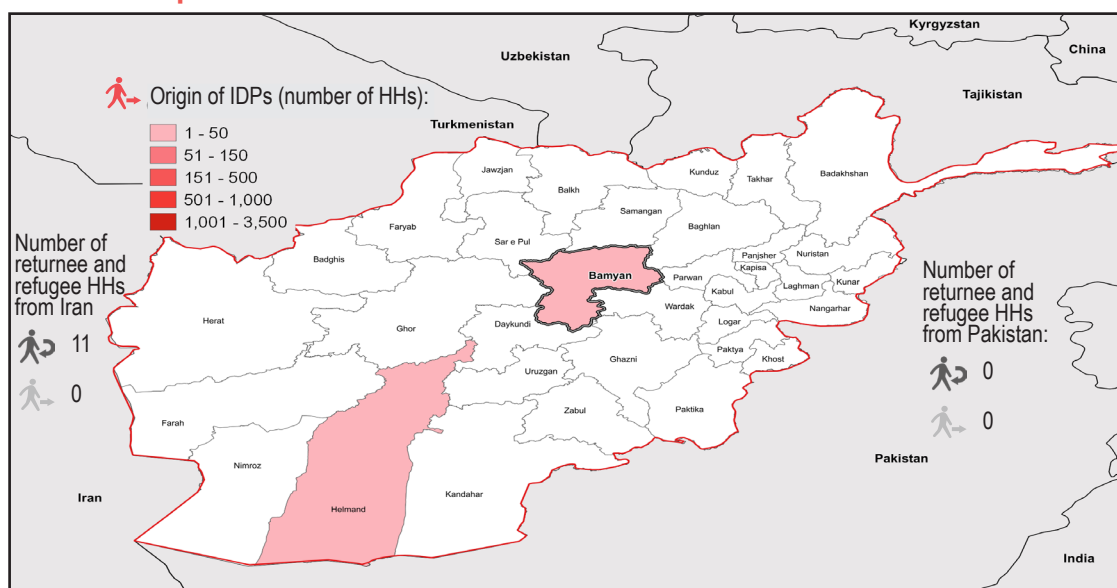

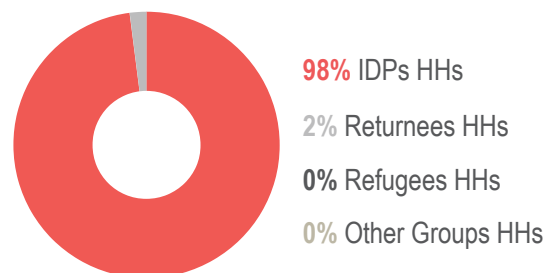

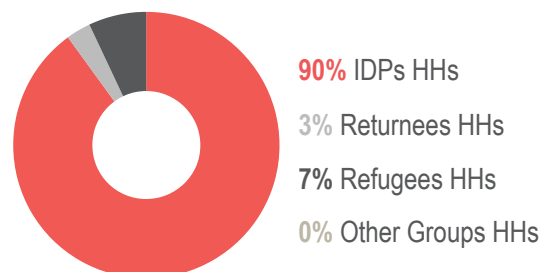

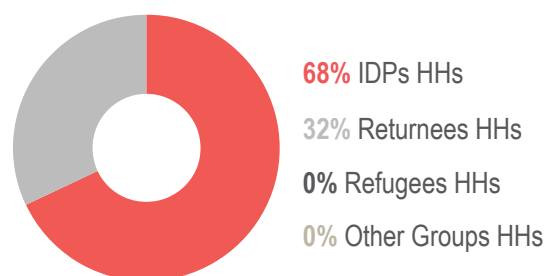

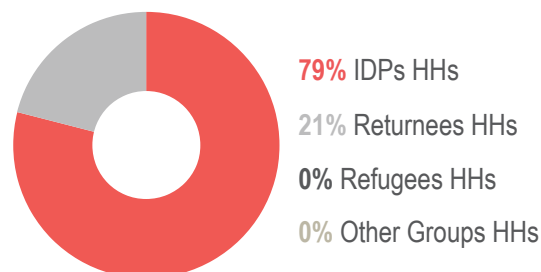

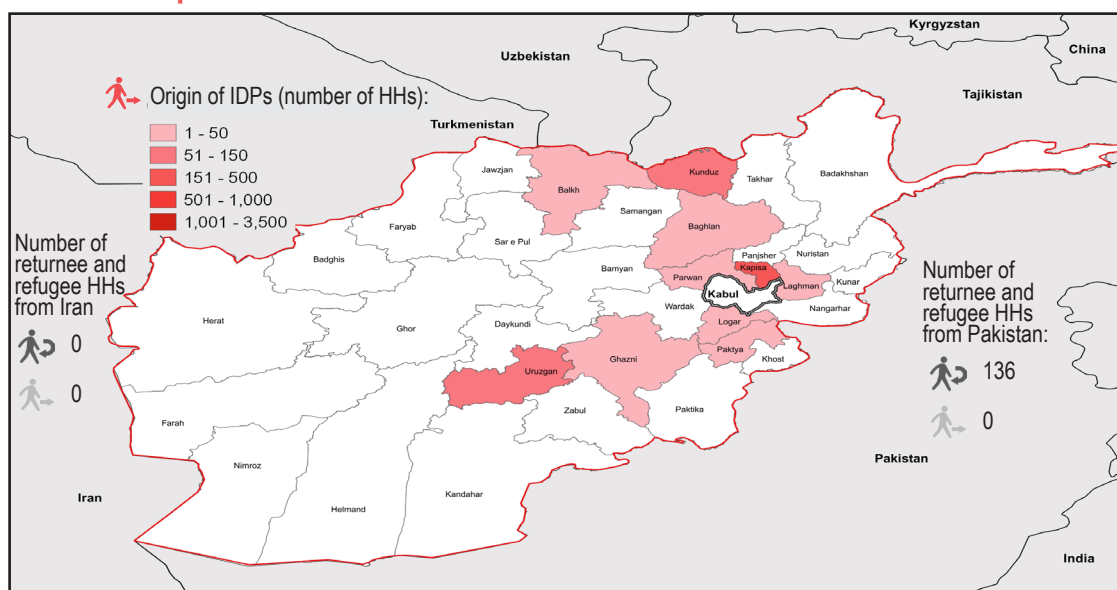

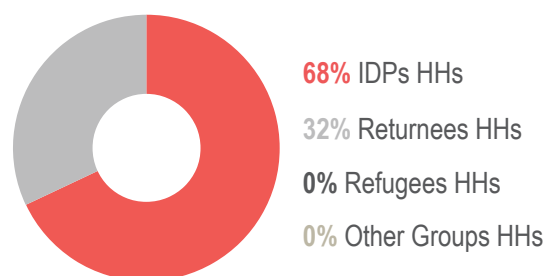

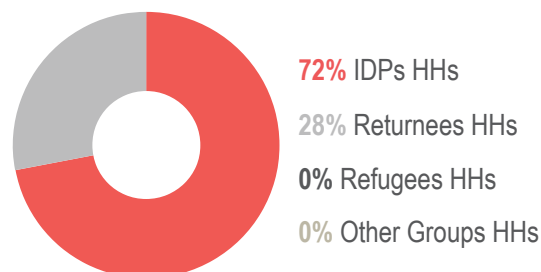

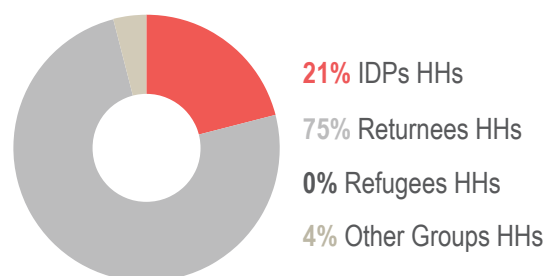

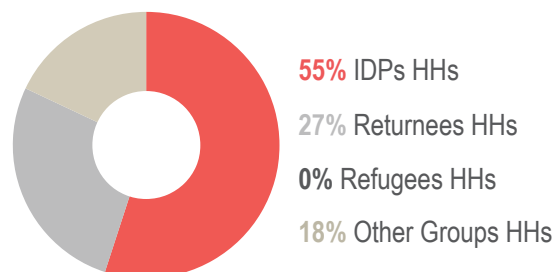

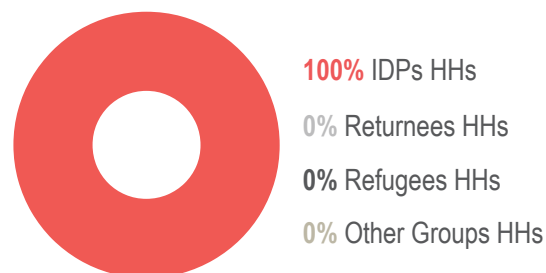

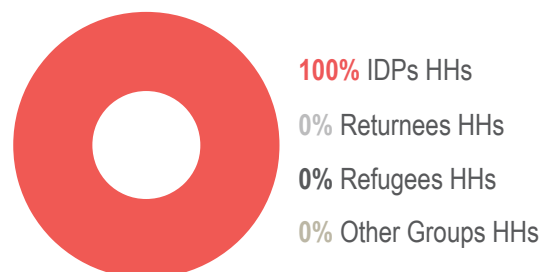

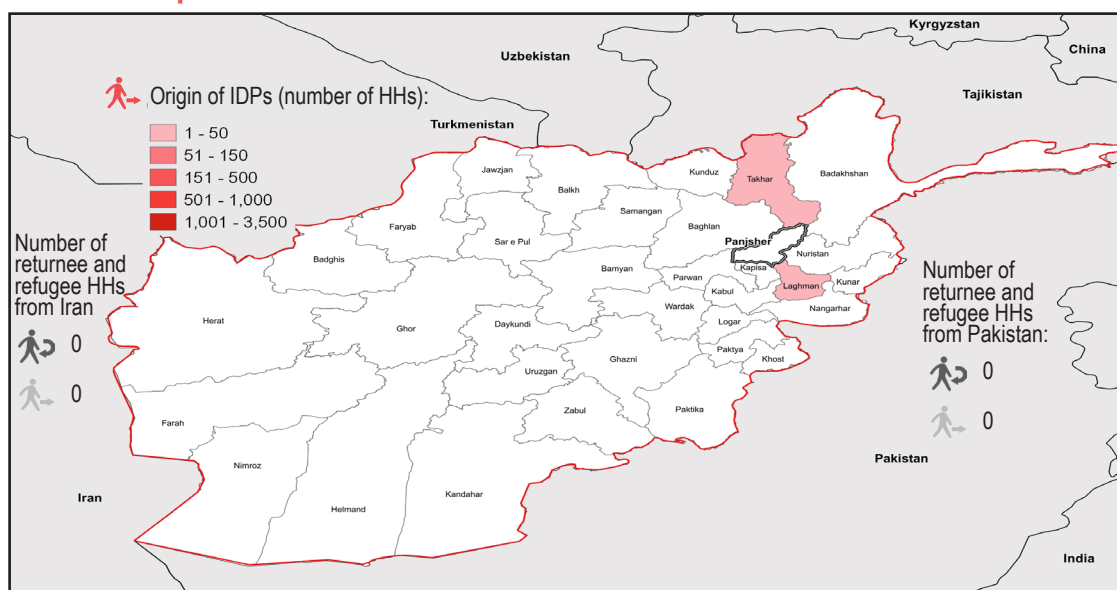

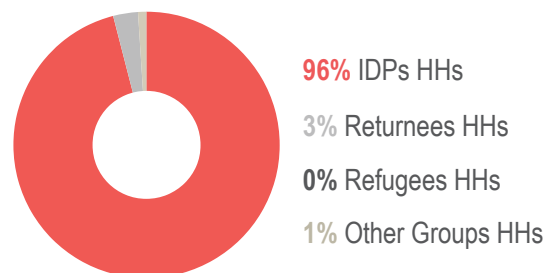

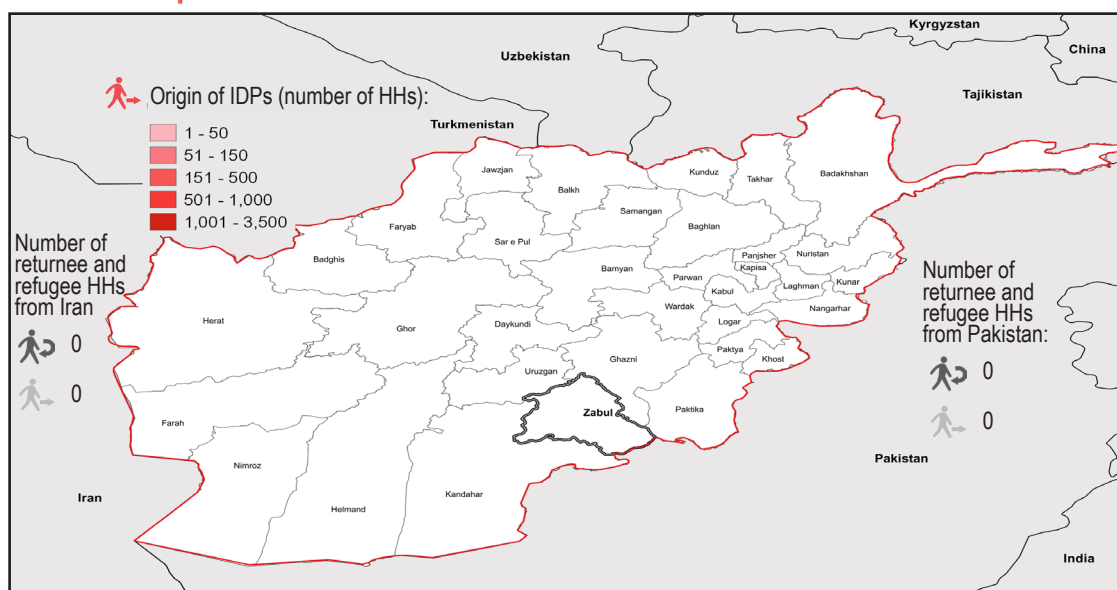
