

### **Informal Site and Settlement Profiles** Ar-Raqqa, Deir-ez-Zor, Menbij, Syria June 2020

### Background

Over the past six months, changing areas of influence and economic instability have shaped the context for displacement in Ar-Ragga, Deir-ez-Zor, and Menbij. In October 2019, increased military activity in Ar-Ragga and Al-Hasakeh governorates led to mass displacement (including the closure of two camps for internally displaced persons (IDPs)) and a disruption of the strategic M4 highway. 1 Forced recruitment by armed forces has also reportedly been a driver of displacement in some areas.2

January 2020 brought the expiration of the United Nations (UN) Cross Border Resolution for Syria. While the resolution was extended for six months, several border crossings in northeast Syria (NES) lost authorisation, cutting off key routes for UN aid to come into NES.3

In the six months prior to data collection, economic conditions deteriorated in NES, and the prices of basic goods increased markedly. This was partially due to the instability and decline of the Syrian Pound (SYP) against the US Dollar as well as the escalation of conflict in northwest Syria in early 2020.4

At the time of data collection in mid-June, there had been five confirmed COVID-19 cases and one death in NES.5 At the time of writing, however, a reported spike in infections has led to a cumulative 204 cases and 9 deaths.<sup>6</sup> Those living in informal settlements and collective centres in NES have been highlighted as a particular concern.7 For key findings on COVID-19, please see page 3.

### Methodology

REACH's informal settlement profiling in NES consists of key informant (KI) interviews with community members who have knowledge of settlements. One to two KIs were sought for each of the informal settlements and collective centres verified by the NES Sites and Settlements Working Group (SSWG).8,9

Data collection took place between 15-24 June 2020 through remote (phone) interviews. In total, 165 sites were assessed in 14 sub-districts in Deir-ez-Zor, Ragga and Aleppo governorates. This document highlights COVID-19 vulnerabilities such as susceptible groups, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and health capacities and needs. The full data set can be found here.

Due to the KI methodology used, findings are not statistically representative and should only be considered as indicative of the situation. The assessment was carried out at the settlement level and data is relevant only for the assessed settlements and not the communities they are in or near.

As part of this assessment, data was also collected in Al-Hasakeh sub-district, the findings of which are available here. These assessments follow a previous assessment of informal settlements in NES in April 2020 - this set of profiles can be found here.



### **Key Findings**



Reported % of assessed settlements with drinking water quality issues

In 31% of assessed settlements in Deir-ez-Zor. KIs reported half or fewer residents had enough water to meet their daily needs (Ar-Raqqa 25%, Menbij 11%). Reportedly, no latrines were available at 100% of assessed settlements in Menbij (Ar-Raqqa 6%. Deir-ez-Zor 12%).



Reported % of assessed settlements with access to medicine to treat chronic illnesses

In Menbij, 28% of assessed settlements had no access to a health facility, compared to 25% in Deir-ez-Zor and 15% in Ar-Raqqa. No medicine for chronic illness (either free or paid) was available in 28% of assessed settlements in Menbij and 26% in Ar-Ragga and Deir-ez-Zor.

% of assessed settlements reportedly receiving aid distributions in the 30 days prior to data collection


KIs reported all assessed settlements in Menbij had received an aid distribution in the 30 days prior to data collection, compared to 62% in Ar-Ragga and 64% in Deir-ez-Zor. The most frequently reported information need in all areas was how to find job opportunities.

KIs reported that residents did not have enough food in 74% of assessed settlements in Deirez-Zor, 70% in Ar-Raqqa and 83% in Menbij. Food was reported as a priority need for 50% of settlements in Menbij, 61% in Ar-Raqqa and 83% in Deir-ez-Zor.









Ar-Ragga, Deir-ez-Zor, and Menbij, Syria June 2020






# Key Findings - COVID-19 Vulnerability


The findings presented on this page highlight indicators that are relevant to assessing settlements' vulnerability to COVID-19 and ability to seek treatment. Evidence on the spread of COVID-19 to date suggests that elderly populations are more vulnerable to the disease, with a significantly higher fatality rate among over-60s.11 Access to health facilities indicates how available medical care is in case of illness. Similarly, the availability of medicine to treat chronic illnesses may be indicative of medicine availability more generally and may determine whether residents with chronic health problems can access appro-


Handwashing with soap has been promoted as an effective way to kill the virus and limit its spread. 12 However, use of this prevention method is only possible where populations have access to sufficient water to meet all their needs. Physical distancing has also been widely promoted as a prevention measure;12 the prevalence of communal latrines and other shared facilities indicate that physical distancing may not be possible in all locations. Likewise, lack of bathing facilities indicates barriers to sanitation practices which could reduce the risk of infection.


Proportion of residents who reported to be aware of COVID-19









Proportion of residents who reportedly consider COVID-19 an important










Proportion of residents who have reportedly received information on COVID-19







Reported modalities in which information was received\*


